### **The Organ Recital**

David Heilbronn gave a brief history of the church organ and detailed the effort involved in its restoration.

David then introduced Val Estrella's tutor who gave us an introduction to the evening's program. He spoke of the variation in tone and intensity the church organ can produce.

He also praised Val for taking the time and effort in finding such an instrument for regular practice... no mean feat! Val Estrella is a Year 11 student who is undertaking organ studies.

Attendees were then treated to a splendid recital by Val.  
The magnificent qualities of the organ were showcased through a variety of classical compositions.

## HISTORY OF THE ORGAN

“Early in 1917, Mr J H Hobbs offered to present a new pipe organ to the Church at a cost of 700 pounds. The organ was built by J E Dodd in Adelaide and was dedicated on 8th November, 1918. The presentation by Mr Hobbs and family was recorded on a brass plate on the case of the instrument inscribed as follows:

“Presented to the Payneham Road Methodist Church by the family of the late Jonah Hobbs.

Erected in loving memory of Jonah and Rebecca Hobbs and their grandsons Harold and Kenneth Hobbs and John Godlee. Dedicated to the Glory of God - November 8th, 1918”....

“....In 1963 a legacy became available and, in 1967, the money was used to make alterations to the Sanctuary, including covering of the pipes with a reredos. The console and choir seating were moved to the western side of the church.... “ In 2016 extensive organ restoration was proposed.

...“The proposed rebuilding and enhancement was aimed at restoring full functionality and bringing the instrument into the 21st century with brighter tonal characteristics and reliable wind supply and actions. The work also involved some minor structural changes which improved the relative positioning of some sections of the instrument and provided safer working conditions for future tuning and maintenance.... “
