President Keith then delivered a very informative session on his family and Rotary involvement.

BEHIND THE BADGE – G. Keith Payne



Keith has English, Scottish & German Ancestry. It all started when the daughter of a prominent city musician was introduced to a Murray Mallee farmer and local tennis champion. They had very different childhoods and the tyranny of distance. However, love blossomed so Gemmell A. M. Payne and Ruth M. Gratton were engaged 1936. From a pretty wedding in Seacliff to a farm near Murray Bridge. In July 1939, Gemmell Keith Payne was born.

First move - to Pata in 1941 and then a 4 km bike ride to school. A move to Loxton in 1951 and Loxton Area School. Keith's sister Meredith arrived. To a dairy farm at Paracombe in 1951 and Kings College 1952 to 1956. In 1957– Kings College scouts hiked through Tasmania.

In 1957 – started farming at a camp on the farm. Cropping with bags, rabbit & fox hunting, Moved to Loxton again in 1958. Started the hobby of photography - slides and movies.

Keith meets this lovely girl with her own Austin 7 and the use of the family car. In 1962 Keith married Geraldine. First farm home – 'Hilldale'. 1963 bulk handling of grain arrives. Sons arrive - Rex 1963, John 1965 and Bruce 1968. To help Bruce we supported disability organizations.

Went for snow and beach caravan holidays. Keith was a District Councillor & JP. A move to 'Carinya' farmhouse in 1977. Business Partners – Payne & Alcock then Wilpy Farming Company then Tillage and Traction. Started a farm machinery sales and service business from the farm. Endured droughts & dust storms and good seasons too. Keith played tennis in the Riverland and in the Wunkar & Districts Association where he coached juniors. He played golf and had a hole in one when playing at Tanunda in the tournament conducted by the International Fellowship of Golfing Rotarians.

They enjoyed picnics in the scrub on the farm and in 1989 moved to live in Loxton. In 1990 Keith worked on the Save The Bush conservation project and during the next 10 years worked as a Bushcare and Natural Resources Management Officer. He was also involved with local conservation groups. Keith and Geraldine planted native vegetation on an unused road reserve.

In 1987 Keith was inducted as a member of the Rotary Club of Loxton and served as Secretary, Treasurer and Bulletin Editor over many years. He was Club President in 1993-94 and 2004-05 and was DG's Representative for PDG Dennis Henschke.

In 2015 Keith and Geraldine moved to Adelaide to be closer to family and healthcare and Keith joined the Rotary Club of St Peters. Geraldine passed away in 2020.
