## Rotary Area of Focus – The Environment - Plastics

### Local Recycling and Waste Management – Plastics

Last week we looked at rigid plastic that can be recycled via the Yellow Bin. If it bounces back to its original shape then it belongs in the Yellow Bin.

### But what about soft plastics?

The question is often asked about the numbers inside the Recycle symbol...

**IGNORE the numbers and look for the AUSTRALASIAN RECYCLING LABEL**

Recyclable	Conditionally Recyclable	Not Recyclable

This is <b>recyclable</b> at home	Follow <b>instructions</b> to recycle	This goes into the <b>rubbish bin</b>

**OR apply the SCRUNCH TEST**



If it's a soft plastic that **CAN** be scrunched into a ball. Then it cannot be placed in the yellow bin. Take it to the REDCycle bins at the supermarket.

If it **CAN'T** be scrunched into a ball or it bounces back into shape after being scrunched. Then it **CAN** be placed in the yellow bin.

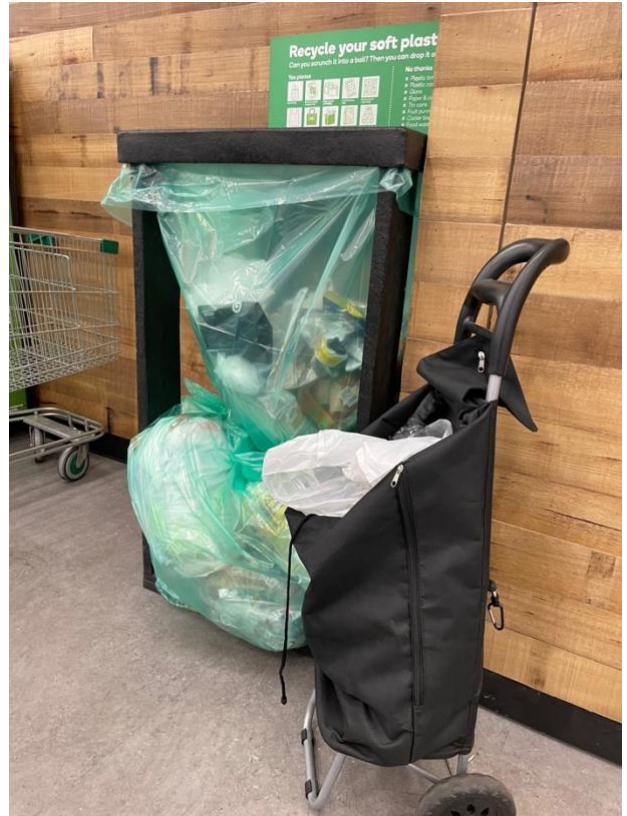






### How to Manage Soft Plastics at Home?
