Flubot

There is a scam message being sent to phones. It purports to be from either 'Your telecom service provider' or just says you have a text message. Often a lot of the words are deliberately miss-spelt. It invites the receiver to click on a blue underlined link. Don't do it because it can lead to a site that will download spy software to the phone which could give the unscrupulous access to passwords and banking details. Apparently, only Android phones are vulnerable.

Guest Speaker – John George – Allkids Cambodia Project

Chairman **Wendy Gaborit** gave some background to this RAWCS ([Rotary Australia World Community Service](#)) **Prek Trabaek Project** through Allkids, that has also been taken up by **Jenny Neale**, partner of DG Jeff Neale. PP **John George** spoke of the Australian Cambodia Foundation Trust established in 1999 to assist children in Cambodia who were not receiving an education. John was Chairman of the Foundation from 2008 -2015. .

John showed us a video of the wonderful work. This video was made by a volunteer showcasing the work of Paul Otto and his team as they provide an ongoing education program for the students. Here is a short history of Allkids.

Our Story

By Paul Otto, founder of AllKids

“In 2010 I came to Cambodia to supervise the construction of a village and clinic for HIV children in the Commune of Ream, close to the coastal city of Sihanoukville. Each day for the next 18 months I was greeted by the same children as I walked through the village to the building site.

I began to question why these kids were not in school and a survey revealed that ~25% of children in the Ream Commune were not attending school regularly.

Towards the end of the project I realized that I was in a position where I could change the lives of the children in Ream for the better, and the concept of AllKids began to form. With the support of Mr John George, a successful businessman and an active Rotarian who has over twelve years’ experience in managing charity organizations in Cambodia, AllKids was established in 2012 as a not for profit, international NGO.”

Allkids is looking to build a Learning Centre and Day Care Program for students to Year Five.

This Project is currently being managed by Paul Otto who has been with Allkids from its inception.

RAWCS is hoping to raise \$40,000.

“Since the commencement of AllKids in 2012, it has always been our primary objective to ensure that all children in the Ream Commune of Cambodia, have access to education. Since then, AllKids have provided educational services to over 1500 children.

Prek Trabaek is located in the south eastern corner of Ream. Just over 90 school aged children live in the area and the closest public school is 17.5 kilometres away. Providing these kids with access to a variety of educational programs will complete AllKids mission to give all children in the Ream Commune access to education.

AllKids thanks Rotarians from District 9510 for kind donations towards the Prek Trabaek Project, supporting the development of a learning centre and day care program for vulnerable children who otherwise would receive no education at all.”

The Rotary Club of St Peters has been a supporter of Allkids, for many years.

Donations have included funds for a Dental Clinic, a school bus, surplus dental chairs and ongoing operations.

Our Club is very proud of its involvement with Allkids. Several members visited the centre about eight years ago.

Another trip was mooted for 2020-21 but had to be postponed due to the pandemic.

Local Recycling and Waste Management

Last week we looked at REDcycle recycling. It would be interesting to find out which local supermarkets offer this facility. If in doubt when considering disposal of soft plastics, check the labelling on the product.



This week we look at hard plastics. What to do with the small bits? Megan Berseki showed us a sneaky hack.

Use a plastic milk bottle or similar... and cut a slit in the side.

This bottle slit is on the side near the label and works effectively.

If small plastic bits are not contained they end up on the recycler's floor... but this way they are contained... ready to be recycled.
