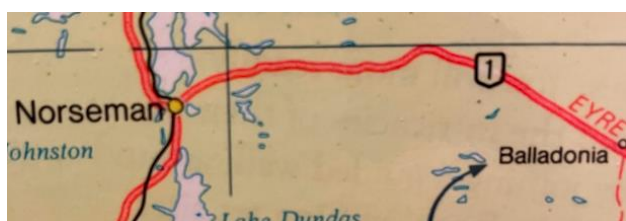

Guest Speaker – Jill Chapman

Chairman John Gallehawk introduced the speaker thus:

“There are currently over 350,000 stated cases of homelessness in Australia each night.

That doesn’t include couch surfing or family consideration Or indeed those who have fallen through the cracks but don’t appreciate being a statistic.

According to the national figures from 2019 the Australian Govt declared 384 individuals between 18 and 24 took their own lives.

There are no figures from 2020..... and as we head towards the end of 2021, read into that what you will.

So, In today’s world There are few things as important as tonight’s subject.

It stems from a basic animal instinct we call, compassion.

One might even argue it forms the premise of a service club such as Rotary. We join a service club because we recognise something is missing in how we might otherwise be showing our gratitude.

Jill is especially unique in that she has the courage to commit to a belief system she holds to be sacrosanct.

I therefore implore you to listen and perhaps even, read between the lines.”

Guest Speaker – Jill Chapman – MOSH – Minimisation of Suicide Harm

Jill shared her story including the fact that her father had written two books of poetry published through John Gallehawk’s Publishing Company.

An unexpected death struck her family.

In recovering from grief, at times she said she felt the need to talk with someone immediately. With a friend she set about creating a space for folk to come and talk. MOSH. An Independent Centre.

Minimisation of Suicide Harm is housed at Thebarton. It is a non-clinical environment. There are no fees. Apart from a paid administrator, all workers are volunteers. Funds are raised through two Charity Shops.

There are several associated programs including school holiday activities, a community garden, community lunches along with informal counselling... an environment where people can have a chat.
