### Western Australian Road Trip - 2021

Rotary Club of St Peters President Keith Payne has just returned from a road trip to Western Australia.

Keith describes the trip –

My friend and travelling companion Dianne Hill and I took a window of opportunity when travel from SA to WA was possible without quarantining for 14 days on arrival. We packed my Subaru Impreza with gear and made a beeline for the border, staying just one night at Ceduna. The permits that we had on our phones seemed to satisfy the authorities at the roadblock on the border. We were then able to relax a bit and after visiting the old Telegraph station ruins, we found a quiet camping spot the other side of Eucla. It was great to be able to have a campfire and see the stars.



At Kalgoorlie we had to set up our tent again because all accommodation was booked due to maintenance being carried out at the mines. We then headed West across the Northern wheat belt (excellent crops) and a nice cabin in Jurien Bay on the coast. Western Australians have been unable to fly overseas and are out in droves in caravans and are taking most of the available accommodation.

After being awed by The Pinnacles, we spent a week in Perth with my cousin and family whom I hadn't seen for several years during which we saw the lovely wildflowers and took a boat trip to Rottnest Island where we befriended a few Quokkas.





No masks required but Covid QR code check-ins were, so we then travelled to the southwestern corner of the state taking the treetop walk in the Valley of the Giants, then through Albany and Esperance before heading back across the Nullarbor. Most of the whales had vacated the Head of the Bight, but we saw the sea lions at Point Labatt.

Our return to Adelaide was via the Gawler Ranges and a trip across Spencer Gulf on the ferry from Lucky Bay to Wallaroo.

Fortunately, I was able to keep in touch with our club via the Internet and Zoom.
