


President's Remarks


Shed News

- David Heilbronn Café Open this Saturday Please note the café will be opening for food and coffee this coming Saturday 16 October.
- 2 **Phil Smith Birthing Kits Assembly** the first stage will be the folding of the plastic sheets in the Shed on Saturday afternoon by a small group. The major Assembly night will be Tuesday, 26 October. There are 35 attendees who have registered.
- 3. **Jim Owler-** Jim has been overseeing the installation of Evaporative Coolers in the Shed for the convenience of both workers and customers. The work is progressing satisfactorily. The electrical and plumbing aspects should be completed in the coming weeks.

New Shed Signs

In 1905, Montague M. Bear, an engraver and member of the RC of Chicago, sketched a wagon wheel with 13 spokes as a club emblem. After some comments from fellow club members, he superimposed a banner with the words "Rotary Club" over some clouds with the wheel. An early Rotary Club of Chicago logo



In 1911, Secretary Chesley R. Perry recommended that "action be taken by the National Association to establish the wheel as the basic part of the emblem of every Rotary club." Clubs were invited to submit designs to an emblem committee before the 1912 convention in Duluth, Minnesota, USA.

New Shed Signs cont.

The word "Rotary" appeared at the top and "International Association" at the bottom. (Rotary became an international organization in 1912.) Clubs were encouraged to use a similar design, placing the name of their city at the bottom instead of "International Association." The number of spokes and cogs was unspecified. As a result, many variations on the emblem were in use by 1918.







In January 1924, the Board formally approved an emblem that was then in use. Not all written descriptions were updated immediately, however. To clear up any confusion caused by the various decisions about the emblem between 1912 and 1929, a standard description of the existing design, with a keyway to show that work was being done, was approved by the 1929 convention.

For many years, the wheel stood alone as our logo. Although the words "Rotary International" are embedded in the wheel, they're hard to read from a distance.

So, in 2013, Rotary expanded the official logo to include the word "Rotary" next to the wheel, but more importantly the emphasis is that it is a brand, not just a logo.



New Shed Signs (cont.)

The Rotary wheel remains our mark of excellence. In addition to being part of the official logo, it may be enlarged for greater impact and used separately but near the logo. There are clear guidelines on how the Mark of Excellence can be used and all clubs worldwide are being urged to change to reflect this. It is hoped that this will result in our brand being more recognisable throughout the world. - o Put such details into a PDF document that is not easily changed.
- When sending start with a small amount of money and ask for a confirmation it has been paid into the nominated account before sending the balance.
