ROTARY CLUB OF ST. PETERS – MUSIC FOR DEMENTIA PROJECT

BACKGROUND

People living with memory impairment (dementia) can sometimes be difficult to settle, entertain, or engage in conversation due to their declining ability to recall events/data, understand statements, and express themselves verbally in a meaningful way.

It has been found that a considerable number of these folk respond positively to familiar and loved music which has the effect of calming their minds and movements, and enabling them to recall and communicate important aspects of their lives.

Relatively small-scale projects in using suitably equipped headphones, to convey music to affected listeners, have been undertaken previously with quite positive results.

The Rotary Club of St Peters project aims to greatly extend the range of supply of headphones to people living with dementia in nursing homes and retirement villages in the St Peters and adjacent areas.

This project is now sufficiently refined to enable other service clubs/organisations to undertake a similar exercise in their local area.

BIRTHING KIT ASSEMBLY HELD ON 26th OCTOBER AT THE ROTARY SHED

Last Tuesday evening our weekly Rotary meeting was held at the Rotary Shed, Linde Reserve, Stepney. A group of 34 Rotarians, partners & guests assembled to undertake the assembly of 600 birthing kits for the Birthing Kit Foundation, Australia.

Following the brief formal meeting conducted by President Keith, the procedure for the Birthing Kit Assembly was explained by International Chair, Phil Smith. The participants then had to wash their hands & glove up in preparation for the assembling of the kits. The production line method for our kit assembly was used. To enable the production to run smoothly, six hundred plastic birthing sheets had already been folded & inserted in their plastic bags at a previous working bee held by the International Committee. Also the strings used in the kits had been cut & tied in groups of three.

The procedure was quite straight forward with each of the components (soap, gloves, gauze, scalpel & string) being added along the assembly line. The package was then rolled up & inserted in the plastic bag with the birthing sheet. The air was squeezed from the bag & it was then sealed. The completed birthing kits were then packed into boxes, each containing 100 birthing kits. It was a very tight squeeze but we managed to get them in. Later the six boxes were sealed ready for collection.



The assembly of the kits took a little over an hour which we considered to be quite good. It was lots of fun & judging by the chatter everyone really enjoyed the event. Hands on events are a great tonic for a Rotary Club. Following the assembly, a pizza meal organised by Rotarian Greg Rogers was enjoyed by all.

Thanks are extended to the Rotarians, partners & guests who assisted in making this event a great success.
