INTERNATIONAL SERVICE MEETING – CLUB ASSEMBLY -16TH NOVEMBER 2021

The International Committee has met regularly this year & last met on 19th October 2021.

Report on projects.

1. All Kids, Cambodia – RAWCS Prep Trabaek Early Learning Centre Project

Fundraising for the RAWCS Prep Trabaek Early Learning Centre Project is progressing well. Donations are now being received with \$11,426 having been donated to 30th October. This includes the \$10,000 donation from our Club. Advice has been received that a donation of \$2,500 from the Rotary Club of Unley has been received by RAWC & that this donation will appear on the November statement.

2. All Kids, Cambodia – Garden Party Fundraiser

Rotarian John George has advised the Club that a committee has been formed to coordinate the proposed AllKids Garden Party fundraiser. Rotarians Arthur Manser & Phil Smith have agreed to be on the committee. This event is planned to be held on 27th March 2022. It is hoped to raise up to \$15,000 for AllKids.

3. Books for Lesotho Inc

An additional 6 boxes of books have now been delivered to Books for Lesotho by Rotarian John Dubberley. Unfortunately David Linn was not available on the day the books were delivered. An update from David Linn on the current situation in Lesotho following the passing of Mme Mosa Muso, (a key figure in the establishment & ongoing operation of Books for Lesotho) will be sought.

4. Birthing Kit Foundation of Australia (BKFA) - Birthing Kit Assembly.

On Tuesday 26th October our weekly Rotary meeting was held at the Rotary Shed, Linde Reserve, Stepney. A group of 34 Rotarians, partners & guests assembled to undertake the assembly of 600 birthing kits for the Birthing Kit Foundation, Australia. Following the brief formal meeting, the procedure for the Birthing Kit Assembly was explained by International Chair, Phil Smith. The participants then had to wash their hands & glove up in preparation for the assembling of the kits. The production line method for our kit assembly was used. To enable the production to run smoothly, six hundred plastic birthing sheets had already been folded & inserted in their plastic bags at a previous working bee held by the International Committee. The procedure was quite straight forward with each of the components (soap, gloves, gauze, scalpel & string) being added along the assembly line. The package was then rolled up & inserted in the plastic bag with the birthing sheet. The completed birthing kits were then packed into boxes, each containing 100 birthing kits.. Later the six boxes were sealed ready for collection. The assembly of the kits took a little over an hour. Following the assembly a pizza meal organised by Rotarian Greg Rogers was enjoyed by all. A written report was provided to the bulletin editor for publication.

5. Donations to International Rotary programs & programs supported by RI

Good Plant Solutions for Rotary

On the 14th of September, Una Hobday was our guest speaker via Zoom & address the Club on “ Good Plant Solutions for Rotary”. Una is the Chair for Food Plant Solutions Rotary Action Group and is a PDG and operates out of Tasmania. Following this presentation it was resolved by the committee to make a donation of \$1000 to this organisation. Una is to be invited to attend a meeting via Zoom when the presentation will be made.

1.Design and Creativity Project

Greg Rogers led the Design and Creativity Awards Night this year. The committee provided excellent support. Certificates were prepared by Pam Vaughton and a successful, happy evening was enjoyed by approx. 80 people 9 students made personal presentations supported by their teachers. I would like to consider a different approach next year to ensure we have a wider selection of Creativity and to widen interest and perhaps see girls involved. Apparently, Marden Senior College is changing their curriculum and is unlikely to be involved. The San Giorgio Centre dinner was \$25 pp . The total evening cost approx. \$1375

2.Environmental Project.

Chris Dawson is leading our new Environmental project and is negotiating Norwood Council support (per the letter circulated) for the new Environmental project we are hoping to organise.) We will need to plan criteria for the small grants we plan on making available to applicants. This project may eventually need to be a full club involvement, and a wider issue than just Youth and Vocations. With the backing and advertising to be done by the Council it will provide our club with free advertising. We asked for this kind of support and are delighted with the interest and support offered.

We think grants up to \$ 1000 would likely be needed for an applicant to purchase plants. The details will be worked out by our committee and taken to the Club and Board once parameters are worked out.

3.Environmental Proposal

A brief consideration of raised planters for disabled students (wheelchair bound) at East Adelaide and The Briars will be explored. Chris and Romaine and Sonia will follow this up with Adelaide East. Sonia and Sue will approach The Briars kindergarten. Cost, Size, usefulness for the handicapped and their involvement with planting etc is being discussed initially with East Adelaide Education Centre.
