AllKids Prek Trabaek Project

A RAWCS Project sponsored by the Rotary Club of St Peters



The Rotary Club of St Peters is a long term partner of allKids and has established a RAWCS project to deliver a Learning Centre and Day Care Program in the Prek Trabaek, REAM Commune, Cambodia.

AllKids

Is a non profit NGO providing education to disadvantaged children in Cambodia

Based in **REAM**, coastal community, AllKids provides support to poor communities to help overcome the hurdles preventing their children from accessing education.

Proven Performance

- ✦ Since 2012 AllKids has provided education to 1500 disadvantaged children in Cambodia
- ✦ Currently more than 500 children on the "Kids to School" program who otherwise would not receive an education
- ✦ 123 Children attending AllKids Daycare Centres
- ✦ 750 plus children at the AllKids Learning Centres
- ✦ 32 Cambodian teachers and outreach staff receive ongoing training and support to improve their capacity as teachers and social workers.
- ✦ AllKids Bus network transports Children from Remote communities to approved schools.



Since commencement of AllKids 2012, the primary objective has been to ensure all children in the Ream Commune of Cambodia, have access to education.

Prek Trabaek is located in the south easter corner of REAM. Just over 90 school aged children live in the area and the closest school is 17.5km away. Providing these kids with access to a variety of educational programs will complete AllKids mission to give all children in the Ream Commune access to education.

AllKids: Learning Centres (from the Website)

About the AllKids Learning Centres:

The first AllKids Learning Centre opened in December 2013, it is not a substitute for public school but provides additional resources and training otherwise unavailable to students living in rural Cambodia. At the learning centre children have the chance to study English, IT and Khmer literacy programs.

In 2020, in response to the coronavirus pandemic, we opened a second learning centre in the village of K'bal Hong. This has given over 140 children access to a range of educational activities without having to leave the safety of their own community. AllKids now have over 700 students enrolled in their AllKids Learning Centres.

AllKids Learning Centres have a strong focus on fostering creativity through art, performance and sport. We believe this helps the kids develop a strong community spirit and acts as an incentive for kids to attend study programs.

The Rotary Club of St Peters has donated a large sum to this project over several years. The Club is a proud supporter.

“SUCCESSFUL NOMINATION FOR SCASA PREMIER’S SERVICE CLUB AWARDS ROTARY CLUB OF ST. PETERS – MUSIC FOR DEMENTIA PROJECT

BACKGROUND

People living with memory impairment (dementia) can sometimes be difficult to settle, entertain, ^{[[1]]}engage in conversation due to their declining ability to recall events/data, understand statements, and express themselves verbally in a meaningful way.

It has been found that a considerable number of these folk respond positively to familiar and loved music which has the effect of calming their minds and movements, and enabling them to recall and communicate important aspects of their lives.

Relatively small-scale projects in using suitably equipped headphones, to convey music to affected listeners, have been undertaken previously with quite positive results.

The Rotary Club of St Peters project aims to greatly extend the range of supply of headphones to people living with dementia in nursing homes and retirement villages in the St Peters and adjacent areas.

This project is now sufficiently refined to enable other service clubs/organisations to undertake a similar exercise in their local area.
