Sue spoke of writing her life journey best summed up in an excerpt from her book cover....

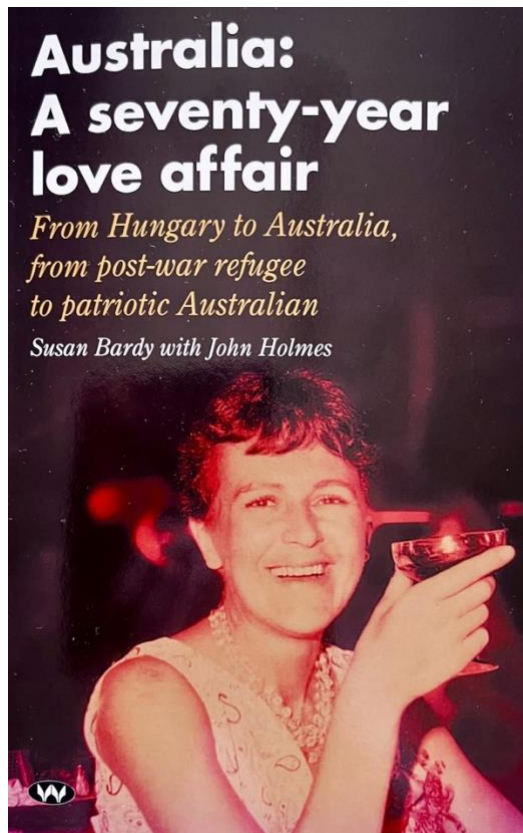
