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### Guest Speaker Don Will – The Environment

Chairman David Birkedale welcomed Don Will from the RC of Eastwood. Don is known to many members through his role of Area Governor several years ago.

The Environment is now the seventh area of focus for Rotary.

“Past Rotary International President Paulo V.C. Costa made the environment one of his primary causes more than 30 years ago, creating a Preserve Planet Earth program and committee to examine ways that clubs and members could plan and carry out environmental initiatives.

Costa outlined his vision for his upcoming term as RI president during a speech at the 1990 Rotary International Convention in Portland, Oregon, United States.

“I have some dreams of my own, which I hope to see come true,” he said. “In answer to mankind’s concerns and the yearning of the majority of my fellow Rotarians, I will be giving very special emphasis to a worldwide plan to defend the environment.


We will create an ecological program, and we will name it Preserve Planet Earth.”

“We have finally caught up to [his] vision,” said Past RI President Ian H.S. Riseley, chair of the Environmental Issues task force, which championed the new area of focus.


Don spoke of the work being done locally – especially on Calperum Sation – managed by the Landscape Trust - 337,000 hectares of land about 15 km from Renmark. Clubs are encouraged to visit and become involved in a variety of programs offered. Many of our members have visited in previous years. (Conference attendees enjoyed hearing from Julie Robertson from Calperum.)

“**CALPERUM CONNECT** is the new strategic plan that builds around Ecology, Education and Engagement. 


The Three Ds – Don, David and David

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### Possible Changes to Rotary Zone and District Administration.

A regionalization pilot has recently been approved for discussion at Club and District level by the Rotary International Board.

The regionalization pilot, to start in 2023, is to test a range of strategies to revitalize clubs, strengthen retention, gain membership growth, focus more on projects and less on administration, trial other governance models and reduce membership dues.

We have been given the freedom to trial Rotary in ways that reflect better our local and regional cultures. The pilot is to last for 4 years and will be administered regionally and all regional positions will be elected by the clubs.

The districts will remain during the pilot, but it is expected that some district functions that are not achieving the above will change – some may move to the regional level, some back to clubs or groups of clubs or not done at all.

The RI Board requires a vote by all clubs in all districts of Zone 8 (Australia, New Zealand and the South Pacific Islands) on this issue. The regionalization pilot will be launched at the District Assembly on May 1<sup>st</sup>.

St Peters Rotarians will have an opportunity to consider the proposed changes.
