David updated us on **The Books for Lesotho** program

Lesotho the Country

“The Mountain Kingdom of Lesotho is in southern Africa, bounded by South Africa. In fact, it is one of only two countries which are Members of the UN and are totally surrounded by one other country.” *From the website*



Lesotho is one third the size of Tasmania with a population of over 2million people.

Water is one of the most important parts of the economy as it is exported to neighbouring regions.

The area grows grain and other food crops.

Mechanisation has enabled better efficiencies and higher yields.

David noted there has also been a transformation in housing in recent years. The country also shows western influences with the advent of the internet. For example, “Whats’ App” is very popular where free wifi is available.

David said there are now supermarkets in the towns and western dress is commonplace.

His association with Lesotho began in 2004 as a result of participation in the Save the Children program.

Books for Lesotho

This program has support from many Rotary Clubs both in South Australia and in Africa. In addition to school libraries, a Community Library has been set up so that books donated can be either suitable for school students in years 1-3, 4-5 and 6-7 or adults. Novels are the most popular books. Mills and Boon romances also rate a mention.
