- Aaron Joined the Salvation Army at 18 years and was the youngest leader in the organization. He has been active for the past 14 years. He is married to Amy who is also a worker for the Salvation Army. They have 4 young children under 9 years including twin boys who are 18 months old. Family life is very busy.
- Aaron's office is based at the Paradise school but they are hoping to move into independent offices in the future.



- In the last financial year, the Salvation Army has provided over 3,000 hot evening meals to those in need. 50-60 people receive a meal every Friday night.
- Food parcels are provided to people in need at Christmas.
- Aaron dyed his hair red 5 years ago and is fundraising to have it removed next Saturday 28 May at 11:59pm. Aaron is hoping to raise \$6,000 for the Red Shield Appeal. He calls it the 'Bye Bye Red Hair' fundraiser.

"I have no idea what I'll look like bald ... but I guess we will find out if we raise \$6000!"

- Aaron is District Chair of a Partnership with Volunteering SA
- Aaron is concerned with the growth of homelessness in SA. The greatest area of increase is women over 55 and children 9-13 years.
- Domestic violence is increasing due to COVID and non-affordable housing in Adelaide is very difficult to secure.
- Aaron concluded by singing 'What a wonderful world' by Louis Armstrong.

Arthur thanked Aaron and presented him with a \$500 cheque from the club.




Good afternoon,


