### **Guest Speaker: Dennis Henschke**

#### Dennis recalled the FAIM (Fourth Avenue in Motion) work trips to Nepal undertaken by St Peters Rotarians.

#### From Wikipedia –

Banepa is a municipality and historical town in a valley situated at about 1,500 m above sea level in central Nepal which is at about 25 kilometres east from Kathmandu. At the time of the 2011 Nepal census, it has a population of 67,690.

The main attraction of Banepa is the temple of Chandeshwori, located approximately 1 km northeast of the town along the Rudramati River. The Dhaneshwor Temple is 1 KM south of the town. Banepa is also known for its eight different temples of Lord Ganesh, Narayanthan (the temple of Lord Narayan), Bhimshenthan (the temple of Lord Bhimshen) and eight different ponds.

Punyamata River, which was the major source of drinking water, irrigation and many other activities, is being polluted day by day. The bank of Punyamata River has been a place where solid wastage has been disposed. The sewage has been connected directly to the river without any treatment and in an unmanaged way has adversely affected the river water.
