Constance is keenly aware of the differences between metro and rural health care. She says she hopes to continue to be involved in rural medicine as a Rural GP.

She was also part of a team vaccination program of 400 clients in cars!

We're aiming to build promo support tool kits and materials to help Clubs better promote their projects - or start a new project.


