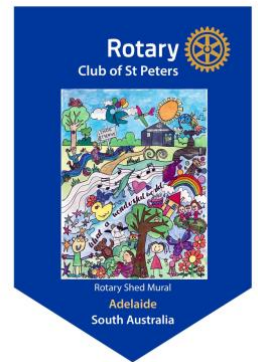

Meeting 3105 held on 1st October 2019 at the Kensington Hotel

Meeting Opening – Sergeant Milton Jones called the meeting to order and Shirley Manser gave the Invocation and Loyal Toast.

President's Welcome - President John George welcomed Rotarians. He gave a special welcome to guest speaker and 9520 District Governor, Tim Klar and Bronwyn. He also welcomed Rotary partners Joan, Margaret, Trena and Anthea.

Guest Speaker – DG Tim Klar was introduced by President John.



DG Tim commenced by talking about District 9520, emphasising that Rotarians are the most important part of the District. He noted that two rivers, the Murray and the Darling join together in District 9520 and he compared this with World President Mark Maloney's theme for this year 'Rotary Connects The World'.

He said Rotary has five core values – Service, Fellowship, Diversity, Integrity and Leadership and when we implement these core values, they are reflected in Rotary's new strategic plan and Vision Statement – 'Together, we see a world where people unite and take action to create lasting change — across the globe, in our communities, and in ourselves'.

DG Tim explained that in order to retain and increase membership we need to embrace new membership models. We need to return to the use of traditional classifications as a tool to gain new members. He also spoke about Rotary's relationship with the United Nations.

Referring to what is happening in our area, Tim said "are we ready for the change that is happening in our District and can we adapt to that change? We are not combining two Districts, but rather creating a brand-new organisation". There will be some significant changes coming as we form the new District 9510. One way will be to make better use of technology. Possibilities are satellite clubs, eClubs and passport, workplace and profession based clubs. Also Rotaract clubs which are no longer a project but are now our partners.

Tim concluded by promoting the District Conference and the Honolulu Convention.



President John invited Bronwyn to speak and she talked about Shelterbox, a project that Bronwyn and Tim have been involved with for 15 years.

She demonstrated the Luminaid, a foldable portable light which incorporates a USB charging port. These devices are now included in a Shelterbox kit. Bronwyn thanked the club for their financial support of the Shelterbox project for many years.



President John thanked DG Tim and Bronwyn for their presentations and said he was impressed by them saying "let there be light" and they provided Arthur with a light and there was light!

He said Tim reminded us of the great work we are doing and said the encouragement that Tim provided is welcomed. As a DG, Tim's commitment to Rotary is huge and all Rotarians need to follow this lead. John was impressed by the notion that the creation of the new District is a new beginning for us, not merely a merger.
