

Operation Flinders Marryatville High School Exercise – (Extract from report)

Operation Flinders Exercise 5A/19 was conducted from the 27th August – 5th September, and involved schools from metropolitan and regional South Australia, including a team from the Marryatville High School.

Funds received from the Rotary Club of St. Peters were allocated to supporting the Marryatville team. It should also be noted that every dollar invested in supporting the Operation Flinders programs is leveraged by many multiples due the substantial inkind and volunteer support that goes into the positive results we achieve in helping youth at risk.

The Operation Flinders program is a vital circuit breaker to help youth make positive choices, to stay engaged in education or jobs and to avoid ending up in the justice system. In addition to many individual success stories, third party studies have clearly demonstrated the significant outcomes that arise from our early intervention work. Whilst the young people will be the immediate beneficiaries, the program has the ability to have a longer-term flow on effect where schools, families and ultimately the wider community will see the benefits of the program.
