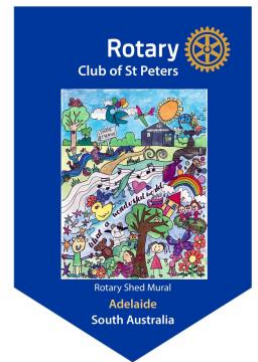

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**Report of Meeting 3114 held on Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2019  
at the Kensington Hotel**

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**Meeting Opening** - Sergeant *Milton Jones* called the meeting to order and *John Dubberley* gave the Invocation and Loyal Toast.

**President's Welcome** – *John George* welcomed Rotarians and guest speaker *PDG Dick Cuttle*. He welcomed back *Arthur Manser* and Arthur's guest *Chris Paassens*.

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**Guest Speaker** – *Dick Cuttle*, who was introduced by *Arthur Manser*, was District 9520 Governor in 2009-10. Dick has spent many years working on the education programs at Calperum Station.

*'The Australian Landscape Trust owns and manages Calperum Station and neighbouring Taylorville Station, just North of the Riverland town of Renmark. Totalling more than 337,000 hectares of rich and unique Mallee country, the properties include breathtaking stretches of creeks, rivers and wetlands which provide habitat for a wide range of native flora and fauna.'*



Dick said he grew up 'over the back fence' from Calperum. The current dry period has meant that a number of projects have had to be put on hold, for example revegetation, which has been put under intense pressure from kangaroos and feral goats.

However other aspects of the station are continuing and there are plenty of opportunities for volunteers to become involved, especially local schools. The project doesn't receive government funding so donations are welcome.

### *David Heilbronn* - **PREVENTING BBQ FAT FIRES**

- **Before lighting the BBQ check that the fat pan is empty**
- **Do not run the BBQ on high for more than 10 minutes**
  - If the plate smokes or the gas bottle freezes then it is high for too long
- **Clean out the fat pan at the end of the day**

### **PROCEDURES WITH A FAT FIRE**

- **Turn off the gas bottle**
- **Saturate a cotton cloth with water**
  - **The cotton cloth is fixed to the side of the BBQ box**
- **Place the cloth in the fat pan**

After chatting with Tracey over a cup of coffee, President John presented her with a cheque for \$4500 to assist TADSA with their 'Freedom Wheels' program. Tracey then thanked President John & the members of the Rotary Club of St Peters for this donation.



TADSA have about 50 volunteers who provide their expertise to build a variety of aids for the aged & disabled in our community. These aids are built to the requirements of each individual & in many cases they can be life changing. Each week TADSA receives about 5 requests for aids that are just not available commercially. They are able to assist in 90% of cases.

It was pleasing for our Club to have an opportunity to assist TADSA once again. We will look forward to having General Manager, Tracey back next year to update our Club on TADSA programs.
