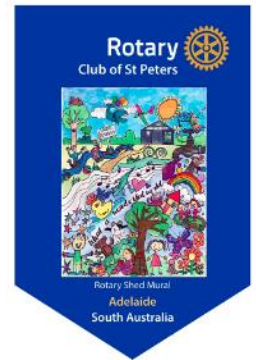

at the Kensington Hotel**

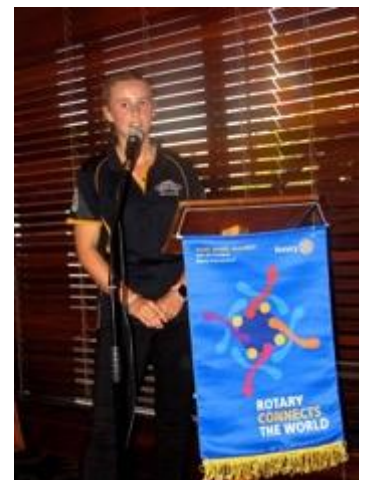
Meeting Opening – Acting Sergeant *Phil Smith* called on *David Birkedale* to give the invocation and loyal toast.
