Guest Speaker – Pam Vaughton – Behind the Badge



“I enjoyed a very happy childhood with my sister Marie and parents Muriel and Jack Edmonds.

I liked travelling 25 km to Terowie School by bus in Primary days. The first bus was a green canvas covered truck with bench seats. This was replaced by a blue ute with a metal back. Neither were dustproof on the dirt roads. The bus kids were all friends together at school.

A yellow Education Dept school bus arrived at about Year 7.

The farm was a mixed wheat and sheep farm. Mother Muriel was in charge of catering and home-chores and father Jack share-farmed and established a merino stud flock. It was my job to fetch the rams from the hill paddock into the shearing shed each night to keep the wool dry and in pristine condition for optimum stud ram sale value. The sheep were very docile and the job time-consuming but pleasant.

I was paid one pound a year – direct credit to my bank account.

My sister Marie inherited that job when I went off to Boarding School at the age of twelve.



Marie and I attended MLC, later Annesley College as boarders for five years. I found communal living very restrictive. However, I made lifelong friends and enjoyed the academic rigour of school.

I won a Teaching Scholarship, and went on to study at various Tertiary Institutions. After graduating I taught at six metropolitan schools over forty years. I always liked work as an Early Childhood Teacher.”

“In 1978 I took twelve months leave and travelled overseas for six months. I had a scriptwriting job from Adelaide and worked in an Office in London. I did minor office tasks for a very large Social Work Centre. Part of my courier duties were around a Fundraiser that was held at St James Palace Kensington.

Princess Grace of Monaco did a presentation during an eight course supper event. The Fundraiser was a great success raising approximately \$A200,000 in current terms.

The whole event was in staggering contrast to the Class Cake Stalls held at Recess time in Adelaide schools!

I have a lovely daughter Caroline, and two grandchildren of whom I am so proud.

Caroline was an enthusiastic participant on the One and All at the age of 15 and did a lot of voluntary work on the ship after the voyage. She loved using the angle – grinder! Caroline endorses our Club involvement in this program.

I enjoy a very busy life. I have started to learn French for the first time. Fun but challenging.

I joined Rotary in 2013. I was, and remain today, very impressed with the level of Club enthusiasm and the friendship extended to me from the beginning by Club members... most of whom are still working in the Club today.

I am looking forward to my year as President.”

## Rotary International President Elect – Jennifer Jones

Jennifer E. Jones, of the Rotary Club of Windsor-Roseland, Ontario, Canada, is the selection of the Nominating Committee for President of Rotary International for 2022-23.

Jennifer E. Jones, a member of the Rotary Club of Windsor-Roseland, Ontario, Canada, has been nominated to become Rotary International's president for 2022-23, a groundbreaking selection that will make her the

first woman to hold that office in the organization's 115-year history.

Jones says she sees Rotary's Action Plan as a catalyst for increasing Rotary's impact.

"As we reflect upon our new strategic priorities, we could have never envisioned that *our ability to adapt* would become our North Star during what is inarguably the most profound time in recent history," Jones said in her vision statement. "Silver linings rise out of the most challenging circumstances. Using metric-driven goals, I will harness this historic landscape to innovate, educate, and communicate opportunities that reflect today's reality."

As the first woman to be nominated to be president, Jones understands how important it is to follow through on Rotary's Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Statement. "I believe that diversity, equity, and inclusion ... begins at the top and for us to realize growth in female membership and members under the age of forty — these demographics need to see their own reflection in leadership," Jones said. "I will champion double-digit growth in both categories while never losing sight of our entire family."

Jones is founder and president of Media Street Productions Inc., an award-winning media company in Windsor. She was chair of the board of governors of the University of Windsor and chair of the Windsor-Essex Regional Chamber of Commerce. She has been recognized for her service with the YMCA Peace Medallion, the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal, and Wayne State University's Peacemaker of the Year Award, a first for a Canadian. Jones holds a Doctor of Laws (LL.D.).

A current Rotary Foundation trustee, Jones has been a Rotary member since 1997.
