- Implementing a recycling program/reducing litter
- Conserving energy
- Monitoring, or improving, water quality in rivers or wetlands

For the patients of the Men's Health Education Rural Van, the free and confidential 10-minute screenings for blood pressure, blood sugar, and cholesterol are a literal lifesaver, notes Graeme Hooper, a member of the Rotary Club of Warners Bay and the van team coordinator.

Recently, the nurse-staffed, two-room trailer returned after a pandemic hiatus. Over seven weeks in February and March, the caravan toured 23 towns and saw 730 patients.

"Of these, 26 percent were requested to see a doctor, while 2 percent needed to see a doctor urgently," Hooper says.

Warners Bay Rotarians plan the route and coordinate onsite volunteers, local publicity, and accommodations for the nurse.



Rotary and ShelterBox renew global partnership – from the RI Website

Rotary International and disaster relief charity, ShelterBox, have announced a three-year partnership renewal.

ShelterBox was founded by the Rotary Club of Helston-Lizard in 2000, forming a special humanitarian alliance has made a tangible difference to the lives of people around the world. Based in the U.K. and with offices around the world, ShelterBox provides emergency shelter and other essential items to people who have lost their homes to conflict and disaster.

With operational headquarters in Cornwall, the charity also has 14 affiliate organisations worldwide. The charity has been Rotary International’s project partner in disaster relief since 2012. ShelterBox has supported more than 2 million people since it was founded in 2000.

Most recently, in addition to their own significant response to the Ukraine crisis, Rotary members have supported ShelterBox’s relief effort. Using their networks in Poland, Moldova and Ukraine, Rotary members have provided invaluable situational awareness and connections enabling ShelterBox to provide aid to those in need.

The charity is providing mattresses to people in collective centres; tarpaulins, rope, tools, and other essentials to help people living in damaged buildings; in addition to supporting women and children fleeing into Moldova.
