## Shelterbox Thankyou



I wanted to thank you for your kind donation to our Haiti Earthquake Appeal last year. Your generosity has made a real difference in the lives of those affected by disaster. One of the reasons we're able to react so quickly when disaster strikes is that our aid is pre-funded by donors like you.

Whilst the current COVID-19 crisis has affected our operations, our response in Haiti was the first time we were able to get teams on the ground since March 2020, when the pandemic put a stop to international travel.

ShelterBox sent a team to Haiti after a 7.2 magnitude earthquake hit the country on Saturday 14th August 2021.

Buildings were flattened and hospitals, already under strain from COVID-19, were overwhelmed. Days later, Tropical Storm Grace dumped more than a foot of rain over some of the worst affected areas.

At least 2,248 people were confirmed killed and more than 12,200 injured, mostly in the Sud Department. An estimated 650,000 people were left in need of assistance. At least 137,500 buildings were damaged or destroyed.

Together with our trusted partner, Habitat for Humanity Haiti, we provided emergency shelter aid. This includes shelter kits (including tarpaulins, tools and fixings), thermal blankets, solar lights, kitchen sets, sleeping mats, mosquito nets, and water carriers. We also included a cash payment for families to buy materials or hire a laborer to clear rubble and help with reconstruction.

ROTARY, our response in Haiti was swift and effective, not least because of our prepositioned aid and effective local partnerships. None of it would have been possible without the support of donors like you.
