 - Led by Angela on Sat 29 Aug
 - Very successful with lots of new faces at the Shed
 - Mainly advertised on FaceBook and posters in dog related venues
 - Featured Hope Springs Eternal who help the disadvantaged keep their pets
 - Hope Springs Eternal are placing a donation machine on our front counter for a month
- 6. Covid Issues
 - Now have to have a Covid Marshal on duty on the Saturday mainly to enforce Social Distancing and the Disinfecting Regime
 - Registered Marhals David Heilbronn, Sue Bardy, Chris Dawson
 - Seems to be working well with 90% of customers cooperating
 - The Attendance Recording has been strongly supported by most customers
 - The screens made by George Dimitriadis are working well

3. President's Report – President Bill

 I am pleased to report that the committees appear to be active and inclusive and each of them have made progress on their respective missions. Congratulations to the Community Committee led by David Birkedale for securing a \$5000 grant to supply materials to the Music for Dementia program. Full marks to the International Committee under the guidance of Phil Smith, which has already donated bicycles to the Bikes for Refugees program and is progressing on a number of other initiatives including The Birthing KITS production. An area that I feel 'plants the seeds' is Youth. Romaine Dawson's team has already interviewed students for the NYSF and shown others that after the disruption to the program last year that we have not forgotten them.

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- Fundraising, under the guidance of David Heilbronn has been performing well after the Shed shutdown. As we are all aware, this is the foundation for our club to support projects far and wide. I would ask that more members volunteer for shed opening days as the ones who regularly work are being stretched a bit too much. As my work commitments will be reduced, I hope to see more of you on Saturdays in the future.
- Volunteers are an invaluable resource to our clubs' activities, especially Fundraising. They give freely of their time to our mission and I would ask members to be mindful of this and treat them with respect and dignity. 7. International Report – Phil Smith (Presented by John Dubberley)

Committee Members – Phil Smith (Chair), Milton Jones, Keith Shaw, Greg Rogers, John Dubberley The International Service Committee has met each month this Rotary year.

Items discussed:

1. Budget – The International Committees budget for this Rotary year was set at \$9750.

2. Correspondence received

Committee members were provided with a list of correspondence received at each meeting.

3. Days for Girls (DfG) - Donation of sewing machines

Susanne Harris, the SA representative for Days for Girls, was contacted in regard to the possible donation of sewing machines held at our shed. Subsequent to this invitation Susanne attended the Rotary shed & inspected the sewing machines on offer. She accepted 4 machines, one of which will be sent for use in the Congo. Susanna also accepted a quantity of fabric offered by the clothing ladies. She advised us that in the past week her team had prepared 875 DfG feminine hygiene kits which will be transported & distributed to third world countries by World Vision.

4. KIT International (Formerly Birthing Kit Foundation of Australia) – Assembly Evening The committee has resolved to conduct another Birthing Kit Assembly evening on Tuesday 24th November which is a normal meeting night. The event will be a partners night & will be held at the St Peters Youth Centre, Dunstan Grove which has been offered to the Club by the NPStP Council at no cost. It is proposed to provide a meal (Individual packs) & quotes are currently being obtained. 200 kits will be assembled at a cost totalling \$1000.

5. Donations to International Rotary programs & Rotary supported programs.

The following international programs will be supported by our Club this year.

• Interplast Australia - Sends teams of volunteer surgeons, anaesthetists, nurses and allied therapists to developing countries in the Asia Pacific Region to provide free surgical treatment and medical training. \$1000 donation recommended.

• Disaster Aid Australia - A project of the Rotary Club of Endeavour Hills & is a member of Disaster Aid International, a partnership of Rotary Based organisations dedicated to providing Humanitarian Aid. A donation of \$2000 to assist in the purchase of a 'Sky Hydrant' - An ultrafiltration solution engineered for harsh, remote environments and designed to deliver safe, clean drinking water using world class water treatment technology. Each SkyHydrant unit can produce 10,000 litres or more of clean water daily.

• RAM (Rotarians Against Malaria) - A donation of \$500 which will provide 100 nets at a cost of \$5 each. RAM coordinates the distribution of insecticide-treated nets to vulnerable populations in Papua New Guinea, the Solomon Islands and more recently, Timor Leste.

6. School of St Jude – Ongoing support of student named Hilda

The Rotary Club of St Peters has been a long term sponsor of Hilda, a student at the school of St Jude. It was recognised by the committee that the Club had been a long term supporter of this student & supports the payment of her school fees of \$1440. However it is noted that concerns were expressed by the committee in regard to any long term commitments made by the Club & the provision for review of these commitments from time to time.

7. Books for Lethotho Inc.

Books for Lesotho Inc. collects, sorts, packs and transports books that are suitable for placing in libraries in schools in Lesotho, Africa. Committee member John Dubberley has prepared 5 cartons of books ready for delivery to the Books for Lesotho Inc. at St Marys. These books are not text books but fiction books suitable to a variety of age groups & will assist the students understanding of the English language. The books will be delivered on Wednesday, 16th September.

8. Bikes for Refugees SA

We have made a donation of 7 bikes, 2 helmets & 3 spare tyres to Bikes for Refugees SA. Bikes for Refugees SA is a bike recycling scheme supplying bikes, free of charge, to people in need. The scheme meets the refugee/asylum seeker communities need for help with transport. It is not-for-profit registered charity and is run by volunteers.

9. All Kids Cambodia

The Rotary Club of St Peters has been a long term supporter of All Kids. The Club received an email from All Kids coordinator, Paul Otto giving us a comprehensive picture of the current situation of the All Kids operations. Paul also provided a short video which was shown at a recent Club meeting. The committee resolved to recommend that we make a donation of \$2000 to support All Kids programs.

8. Vocational and Youth Report – Romaine Dawson

The Youth and Vocational committee has met regularly since the start of the Rotary year and agreed to approach the years program to include support for primary, secondary and disadvantaged youth.

Our committee budget is set at \$9000 but will need to be reviewed if we are to cover the projects open to us.

1.To date we have completed a large poster identifying the opportunities for youth, offered through our club. This very large poster has been hung in the Rotary shed and promotional bookmarks developed and available for the public visiting the Saturday sales. A letter was sent to secondary schools principals and school counsellors in our area advising of these opportunities.

2. Interviews for the National Youth Science Forum of 3 year 11 students were completed and we currently wait to see if either of 2 of these outstanding students has been accepted (one student transferred to another club). Additionally we have one student to be sponsored from last years selection for the program, and who missed out due to the bush fire cancellations.

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3.We have successfully applied for a District Grant to support super disadvantaged students at Adelaide East Education Centre and will be following through on this new initiative when the formal notification arrives.

4. 25 microscopes have been delivered to East Marden and East Adelaide Primary school. Funded last year, their arrival was held up by the Covid problems with production.

5.A project relating to a Primary Sports Award is on hold due to schools being closed to public visits for discussions.

6.The committee will continue to support Operation Flinders this year if it proceeds.

7.A Canvas Awards Sponsorship in cooperation with the Norwood Council is approved for us to provide 2 /3 awards totalling \$250. Two meetings were held with the Youth. Coordinator and other interaction and initiatives with NPSP Council may evolve. The Canvas Awards (art photography and sculpture?) will be an interesting new initiative for the club.

8.We volunteered to sponsor a student for a sailing experience on the One and All. We were approached by, and agreed to share sponsorship with, the club of Holdfast Bay for student Allysia Potts who sails on September 27 for 5 days. We expect Allysia, a 17 year old student from Campbelltown High School, will speak to us of her experience.

9.Donations were sought by ROMAC. Concerned with their loss of support from Rotary clubs due to Covid we answered their call for support and donated \$1,000.

10.Currently we are organising the Design and Creativity Awards for November 22. This year we will hold the evening at the St Giorgio Club, already booked for the event. An initial letter to schools will be sent during this week.

11.We have a booking for the Music Night to be held again at Marryatville H S. However we are unable to complete details with the school due to their Covid plan. We have been assured our booking is safe for the New Year 2021.
