Report of meeting 3152 held on Tuesday 6th October at the Kensington Hotel.

Opening

Shirley Manser called the meeting to order and *Carmel O'Reilly* gave the invocation and loyal toast. President *Bill Winslow* welcomed all, including guests Sonia Schepticuk, Jim Owler and Tony Camporeale.

Guest Speaker

President Bill introduced Tuckweng Kok -

Most of you here will remember our Past member, Past president and past treasurer Tuckweng. He immigrated from Ipoh, Malaysia originally coming here for his University Studies. Tuckweng graduated from Adelaide Uni then continued on to complete his PhD from the Uni. He ran a very progressive Virology lab at the IMVS for many years developing and introducing some rapid tests for viruses which, at the time, were unprecedented. When PCR technology was finally developed to a point to make these tests available for diagnostic testing, his lab was at the forefront in development.

Many staff who worked in his lab at the IMVS, including myself and Sonia, cut their teeth on novel molecular techniques under Tuckweng's direction. I have a job to this day because of my molecular testing skills in which my first experience was in Tuckweng's lab. Tuckweng is now working for an acclaimed scientific journal reviewing papers for publication. Incidentally, Tuckweng authored numerous publications through his work at the IMVS.

FYI, Tuckweng and his wife Monica are the parents of two successful children, his daughter is a physiotherapist working in Victoria and his son has just left his senior role with Apple in China and now resides near Silicon Valley in the USA.

Tuckweng spoke about the history of SARS (Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome). The SARS coronavirus (SARS-CoV) virus was identified in 2003. SARS-CoV is thought to be an animal virus from an as-yet-uncertain animal reservoir, perhaps bats, that spread to other animals and first infected humans in the Guangdong province of southern China in 2002.

> To give some idea of the dimensions of the virus, he said if it was enlarged 120 times it would be the size of a superfine wool fibre.

The original SARS virus caused a high mortality rate in humans but did not spread readily.

Tuckweng contrasted this with the Covid-19 virus which first appeared in November 2019 in Wuhan, China, is highly infectious and has spread rapidly, mostly through air travel, although 50% of the people infected don't show any symptoms. Fortunately, Australia, being an island, has not been impacted as much as most other countries.

He said that although a lot of research is being undertaken, a vaccine that has passed the tests for safety and effectiveness would be unlikely to be available for at least a year.

Meanwhile, the best precautions to take are good hygiene (washing hands), social distancing and wearing a mask where contact with the virus is likely.
