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## Report of meeting 3153 held on Tuesday 13th October at the Kensington Hotel.

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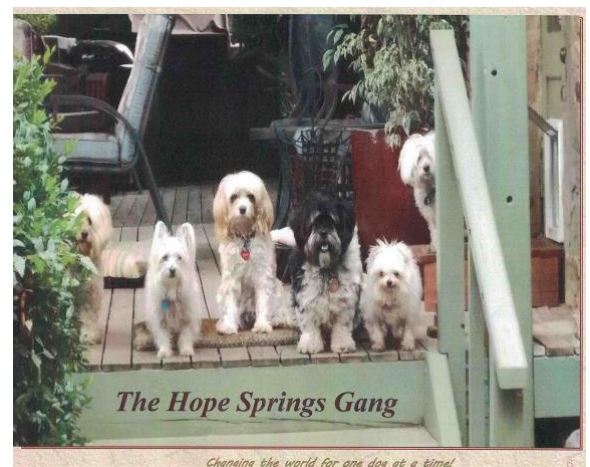
### Opening

## Rehoming

- ✱ **Assessment** – Temperament, Personality, Preferences, Activity Level
- ✱ **Health Check** - Desexing, Microchipping, Dental, Allergies
- ✱ **Welfare** – Toilet Training, Walking on Lead, Socialisation
- ✱ **Promotion** – Profile Pet Rescue, Facebook, share their antics
- ✱ **Matching** – Match the dogs needs and a family's needs
- ✱ **Placement** – Trial to ensure everyone - dog, humans, other pets all get on well
- ✱ **Support** – Phone support, personal support, will take the dog back into care at any time over the course of its life

## Paws & People

*Keeping pets and people together!*

- ✱ When people live by themselves, sometimes their pet is their only friend
- ✱ If they haven't got anyone to look after their pet for them when they get sick it is really worrying for them
- ✱ If people have to leave their home and they don't have another one to go to – they sometimes have to stay in their car with their pet because lots of places that people can stay – don't allow pets to stay
- ✱ People who have to sleep in parks and on benches often don't have enough money to buy food for them and their pets
- ✱ We help these people
- ✱ We look after their pets until they come out of hospital or find somewhere else to live
- ✱ And we make Ruff Rover packs for pets of homeless people that has food, toys, bowls, a blanket and a jacket for the dogs
