## Report of meeting 3154 held on Tuesday 20th October at the Kensington Hotel.

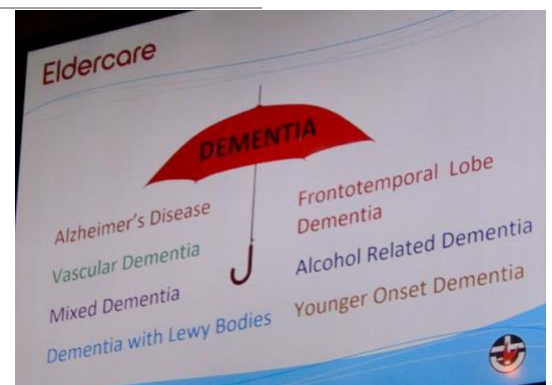
### Opening



*John Bested* called the meeting to order and *Sue Bardy* gave the invocation and loyal toast. President *Bill Winslow* welcomed all, including guests – Campbelltown Rotarian and D9510 DGE Jeff Neale and Jenny, Tanya Liddell, Councillor Kester Moorehouse, Rotarian partners Clarice Seeliger, Joan Shaw and Rhonda Heilbronn, also Paul Holton, Jim Owler and Tony Camporeale.

### Guest Speaker

*John Seeliger* introduced guest speaker Tanya Liddell who is the Dementia Excellence Facilitator with Eldercare. Eldercare has 11 aged care facilities catering for over 1,000 people. Tanya explained that 'Dementia' is the umbrella word for many types of cognitive decline. It is not part of normal ageing, nor just memory loss and can affect younger people. Alzheimer's is the most common form, however only 5% of dementia is hereditary.



Tanya oversees the 'MyMusic' program which utilizes music to give comfort and enjoyment to people with dementia. The program involves creating personalised music playlists for residents which they can listen to using portable devices.

Rotarian *John Seeliger* has been the driving force behind the Rotary Club of St Peters support for the 'MyMusic' program. The Club made a significant donation to the program to facilitate the purchase of special headphones containing a memory card, which can be programmed with music to suit individual people. The Club sought a grant from the City of Norwood, Payneham and St Peters and were delighted when a grant was approved by the Council.



A vote of thanks to Tanya was given by *David Birkedale* and *Arthur Manser* thanked Councillor Kester Moorehouse, who was representing the Mayor, for the support shown by the Council.

### Rotary Club of St Peters - Music for Dementia - History

2019/2020

The "Music for Dementia" program which had been undertaken by the Rotary Club of Geraldton/Greenough in Western Australia was brought to our notice in August 2019. The Community Committee conducted an extensive investigation and decided that this could be a worthwhile project.

3 headsets were purchased and issued to Lutheran Homes Nursing Home. The trial was considered very successful and the Community Committee provided \$2500 to promote the trial further. This covered 60 additional headsets. An extensive program was then carried out (on a trial basis) to 6 nursing Homes. (It was found that the Nursing Home Lifestyle Managers were the best contacts). All nursing homes were keen to get more.

Covid 19 struck and promotion then became much more difficult.

2020-2021

The Club decided that “The Music for Dementia “program should be continued as a major project for this year. A Community Grant of \$5,000 application to the Norwood, Payneham and St Peters Council was successful.

Headsets have now been distributed to all the Homes in the NP & SP Council area again on a trial/success basis. We have had many reports both visually and verbally of the wonderful results. Unfortunately, privacy makes it very difficult to circulate. As of today, 183 Headsets have been issued and we believe most of these are making the lives of those people living with dementia, carers and families much better.

### **Information Spot by *David Birkedale***

For those who don’t know, I am David Birkedale and my current position within St Peters Rotary is the Chair of the Community Committee. As this is a community function I have been asked to briefly describe the functions of the committee, reminding the older and informing the new..

The community committee consists of 6 or 7 Rotarians whose job it is to filter incoming requests for financial support; requests that come from external organizations looking for a donation or Rotarians suggesting a worthy project.

We get requests from the major charities as one would expect as they canvas all possible sources of funds. However, we currently have a policy of directing our funds to places, usually small and local, where we can make a difference. A donation of one or two thousand dollars to an organization with an annual budget of 80 million is not going to make much of a difference.

Our funds are a proportion of the total available after the last trading year of the shed. These funds are a little short this year due to the Covid lockdown. However, a typical year has one or two major projects, this year it is the Music project you have heard about tonight. The community budget also pays for the dinners for our visitors ....

The remainder of the funds will be used for many smaller and medium sized donations in support of varied organizations

e.g. – The Hutt Street Centre

Food Bank

The St Peters Community Garden

The Hope Springs dog rescue

Uniting Communities Christmas Hampers (was cakes)

The budget also covers the cost for the St Peters Pageant (unfortunately cancelled this year)
