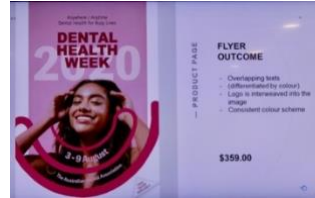
Romaine Dawson, the Rotary Club of St Peters Vocational and Youth Director, presented a cheque to each student to assist them to continue with their chosen field.

The Awardees

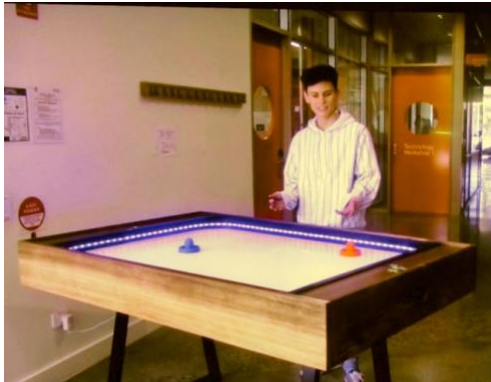
Will Davis from **Pembroke School** showed his skills in computer programming.

A wooden sideboard was the result of work by Austin Arnold.

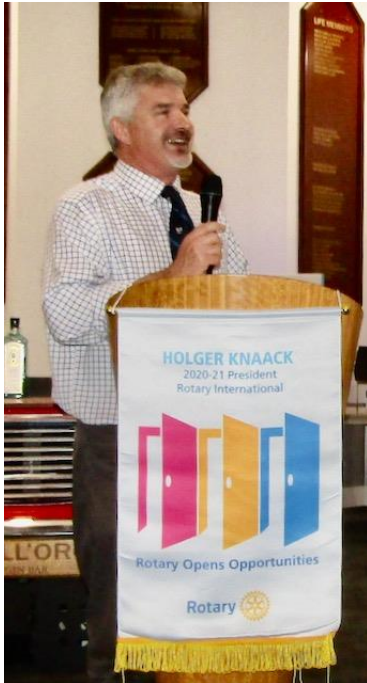


Jason Dell’Oro made a unique Gin cabinet based on a car front end.

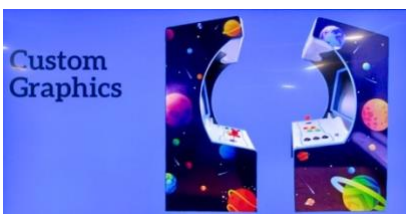


Figure 93: The canopy mounted to the ute with its doors closed.
