Report of Meeting 3158 held on Wednesday 1st December at the Rotary Shed

This Rotary meeting was one not to be missed. The Club is well known for its highly successful 'Shed' whereby members provide a service to the Community by recycling goods and using the money raised to benefit people who are in less fortunate circumstances.

However, this meeting epitomized the notable social and fellowship aspects of the Rotary Club of St Peters. Rather than following the Community stereotype of Rotary being a group of stuffy old and often wealthy businessmen having weekly dinners, one could be forgiven for thinking it was a just a group of people having a lot of fun and fellowship. The meeting was held on the lawns in front of the 'Shed', the weather played a few tricks with some chilly, gusty winds, but this did not detract from the happy occasion when two new members joined the Club.



Opening

Chairman *Arthur Manser* opened the meeting and *Carmel O'Reilly* gave the invocation and loyal toast.

Carmel reminded those present that Rotary members are encouraged to follow 'The Four Way Test'.

She said "the 'Four Way Test' is successful because it deals with human relationships. It recognizes that the welfare of each individual is the welfare of us all. That makes it ideal for an organisation such as Rotary."



Carmel explained that the test was coined in 1933 by the president of an American aluminium products company. The test, when applied to the employees, was credited with lifting the company out of bankruptcy during the depression. In 1940 the 'Four Way Test' was adopted by Rotary International.

They settled in Western Australia where Jim worked in electrical construction, mostly in the iron ore industry in the Pilbara region. After a time in Whyalla, they moved to Adelaide with their two sons.

Jim then undertook a tough challenge in West Papua, Indonesia, using helicopters to install high voltage transmission lines over terrain up to 4,700 metres above sea level. They moved to Melbourne for 8 years before returning to Adelaide to enjoy retirement.
