#### **Sewing group for Congolese women**

Brian Kretschmer's sister-in-law, Bronwyn, contacted him late last year about the possibility of our club donating some fabric available from our shed sales for sewing lessons.

Bronwyn is a volunteer with STTARS, the Survivors of Torture and Trauma Assistance and Rehabilitation Service in Adelaide.

Bronwyn had volunteered to run a sewing group for Congolese women, teaching them how to use a sewing machine.



These women are largely isolated in their own homes, and are looking for social contact, as well as the opportunity to learn how to sew for their families so that they can save money.

It would be great if they could come to the shed, but it is too far away from where they live!

They were to begin with the basics like sewing cushion covers, shopping bags, and children's pant, the first being the making of face masks! Following that move onto making dresses!



Bronwyn was looking for the following materials:

- Brightly coloured lengths of cotton fabric (no stretch, nothing shiny)
- Brightly coloured sheets or doona covers that we can cut up for lining fabric
- 1" wide elastic

After contacting the Shed manager, David Heilbronn, Bronwyn and Brian met Rhonda Heilbronn and Barbie Birkedale at the shed one Thursday morning.

A big thank you to Rhonda and Barbie, and Jenny Carey for making material and fabric available, they were really pleased to be able to help.



As can be seen by the photos the ladies are up to the task! It was a great success! They were only expecting about 4 ladies and 10 to 12 have turned up!

The Clipper Ship City of Adelaide is the world's oldest clipper ship. Built in Sunderland, England, and launched on 7 May 1864. City of Adelaide was built by William Pile, Hay and Co. for transporting passengers and goods between Britain and Australia. Between 1864 and 1887 the ship made 23 annual return voyages from London and Plymouth to Adelaide, South Australia. During this period she played an important part in the immigration of Australia.


On the return voyages she carried passengers, wool, and copper from Adelaide and Port Augusta to London.
