Guest Speaker - Cherilyn Fleming from RAM - Rotarians Against Malaria

Chairman Phil Smith introduced Cherilyn Fleming.

Cherilyn joined the Rotary Club of Adelaide South (now Adelaide Central) in 1992. She then moved to the Rotary Club of Blackwood, where she was President in 2009 – 2010.

Having retired and moved to Goolwa; Cherilyn is now a member of the Rotary Club of Encounter Bay.

Cherilyn's work has involved the development and implementation of education and training programs for adults who are disadvantaged. They have included prisoners, those experiencing homelessness, rehabilitating alcohol and/or other drug users and people with multiple disabilities and challenging behaviours. Cherilyn has just taken on the D9510 Rotarians Against Malaria role as Regional Supervisor and she is presenting about the work of RAM.

Sonia Schepetiuk thanked the speaker, Cheryl Fleming (right), and Milton Jones presented her with a cheque from the Club.




