President Bill welcomed attendees at the Foodbank Premises at Cross Road, Edwardstown.

ROTARY CLUB OF ST PETERS – 4TH MAY 2021 – VOCATIONAL VISIT TO FOODBANK SA

This week 14 St Peters Rotarians & partners visited the premises of Foodbank SA at Edwardstown.

Chief Executive Officer of Foodbank SA, Greg Pattinson, initially addressed the group giving a comprehensive overview of the groups operations here in South Australia.

It was noted that Foodbank is Australia's largest food relief organisation & provides more than 70% of the food rescued to food relief organisations.



Following Greg's initial presentation, the group was then taken into the Foodbank warehouse. This is an expansive & well organised warehouse comprising extensive racking for the palletised food, cool rooms for the perishable goods & even a small 'Food Hub supermarket'. Greg explained how the goods were acquired, much being donated but some having to be purchased. In the cool rooms we were shown the fruit & vegetable which had been donated – it was all excellent quality. Greg explained how Foodbank was expanding its operations & now has warehouses in Murray Bridge, Mount Gambier & Whyalla. One of the big initiatives was the establishment of Food Hubs – supermarkets where clients are provided with 'a dignified' supermarket shopping experience.

Currently we have 9 Food Hubs here in SA with another 2 to open in the near future.





One of exciting initiatives was the 'meal packs' which Foodbank were providing. These pack come with all the ingredients for a meal complete with a detailed recipe. They will feed a family of 4 for between \$4 & \$6 & you can even go onto YouTube to be shown how to prepare the meal.





At the completion of the tour President Bill thanked Greg for his most informative tour of the Foodbank warehouse operations.

Community Chair, David Birkedale presented Greg with a cheque for \$2000 to assist Foodbank in their most valuable work.
