She is a member of the Waste Management and Resource Recovery Association of Australia (WMRR) Education Network and continually strives to implement innovative and engaging ways to educate and influence the community in best practice recycling and waste reduction.

Megan commenced by saying she was about to talk 'a lot of rubbish', but in reality, she told of the sensible approaches being taken by waste management authorities and district councils to recycle as much waste as possible and therefore minimize the amount ending up in landfill.
