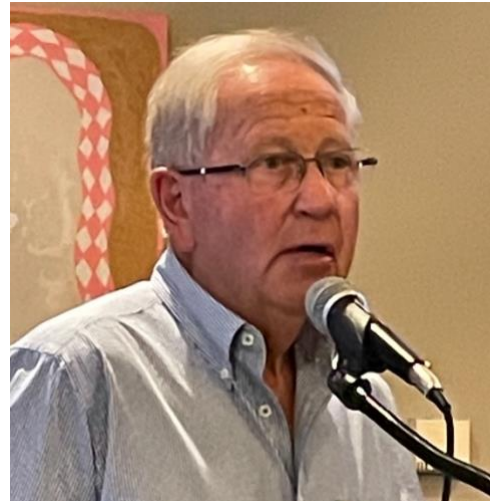

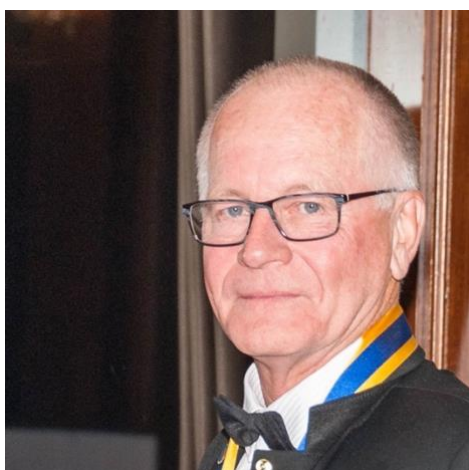

New Barbecue Hotplate instructions

USING AN ELECTRIC GRIDDLE

1. Lightly oil the hotplate^[1]^[SEP]2. Turn to 180C for general BBQ cooking.
 - It runs on a thermostat so turning the griddle to a higher temperature does not decrease the warm-up time BUT IT WILL DRASTICALLY INCREASE THE DIFFICULTY OF CLEANING THE HOTPLATE AT THE END OF YOUR SHIFT
3. Turn "Off" the griddle when you have finished the current batch of food. LEAVING IT "ON" WILL DRASTICALLY INCREASE THE DIFFICULTY OF CLEANING THE HOTPLATE AT THE END OF YOUR SHIFT.
4. The griddle hotplate is made from stainless steel which heats and cools rapidly and is intended for controlled temperature cooking rather than cast iron which can be left "On". If you are only using one side of the hotplate – turn the other side "Off" as LEAVING IT "ON" WILL DRASTICALLY INCREASE THE DIFFICULTY OF CLEANING THE HOTPLATE AT THE END OF YOUR SHIFT.
5. IF THE HOTPLATE SMOKES THEN THE TEMPERATURE IS SET TOO HIGH. THIS WILL DRASTICALLY INCREASE THE DIFFICULTY OF CLEANING THE HOTPLATE AT THE END OF YOUR SHIFT.
6. Minimise the use of metal scrappers on stainless steel surfaces. Use a plastic/silicone scraper instead.
7. At the end of your shift, clean the hotplate by:
 - Heating the hotplate to 180C^[1]^[SEP]
 - Pour on a SMALL amount of water^[1]^[SEP]
 - Rub immediately with the Blue Chux Wipes using a pair of tongs (with silicone tips to avoid^[1]^[SEP]scratching the stainless steel) or a Scotch-Brite pad with a handle^[1]^[SEP]
 - Repeat as necessary^[1]^[SEP]
 - The more you have mistreated the stainless steel, the longer this will take^[1]^[SEP]
8. Empty and clean the fat pan^[1]^[SEP]

INTERNATIONAL SERVICE MEETING REPORT – AGM 7TH December 2021 - Phil Smith

International Chair- Brief Summary of the International Committee activities from July to December 2021

1. School of St Jude - sponsored student, Hilda Leonard Mabay.

The committee has continues to sponsor Hilda's education at the School of St Jude, Sisia, Tanzania. \$1440 was paid for her annual school fees.



2. All Kids, Cambodia – RAWCS Prep Trabaek Early Learning Centre Project



An application to RAWCS to support the AllKids Prep Trabaek Early Learning Centre Project was successful. The project is being supported by Jenny Neale (DG's wife) as her 'DG Partner Project' & is being promoted by Jenny at all the District Governor's Club Visits. To date \$14,490 has been donated by Rotarians & Rotary Clubs including \$10,000 by our own club. It is noted that on the 22nd November the AllKids' Prek Trabaek Learning Centre was officially opened with 45 children enrolled & being taught by 3 local teachers. This location will serve as their base until the construction of its own centre, for which these funds are being raised, is completed.

3. Books for Lesotho Inc

The committee continues to support the supply of books for teenagers & young adults to Books for Lesotho Inc. Over the past months appropriate books have been sought by our shed book team & to-date two deliveries of books have been made. Later in the year we will invite David Linn, their CEO, to update the club on their activities & a donation to this project will be made.



4. Birthing Kit Foundation, Australia

In October 34 Rotarians, partners & guests met at the Rotary shed where they assembled 600 birthing kits for the Birthing Kit Foundation, Australia. The committee provided \$3000 for the purchase of the kit components. These kits will be distributes in developing countries where they will help to significantly reduce deaths during birth.

5. Donations to International Rotary Programs & programs supported by RI – Good Plant Solutions for Rotary.

In September, PDG Una Hobday was our guest speaker via Zoom & address the Club on "Good Plant Solutions for Rotary". Una is the Chair for Food Plant Solutions Rotary Action Group which operates out of Tasmania. Later this Rotary Year Una is to be invited to attend a meeting via Zoom where she will be presented with a donation to this program.



6. All Kids, Cambodia – Garden Party Fundraiser

Under the leadership of John George a committee has been formed to coordinate the AllKids Garden Party fundraiser. Rotarians Arthur Manser & Phil Smith have agreed to be on the committee.

This event is planned to be held at St Peters Girls College on **27th March 2022**.

It is hoped to raise up to \$20,000 for AllKids. Club members will be requested to assist in this event as they did at the last garden party fundraiser.

This will include event set-up, provision of home cooked foods and tidy-up after the event.

Shed Safety Update

The next Shed Meeting will be Friday, 14 Jan to look at more permanent lines of delineation for goods and storage, and review progress on a two-part hazard safety checklist.

Items needing further work include:

- Relocating the first Aid Station
- Notifying members and volunteers of the need for items to be placed INSIDE the wooden boxes in the wide aisle
- Determining lines for the wide aisle near the boxes
- Regular updates for members and volunteers
