I grew up on a dairy farm in Meningie, and then later Victor Harbor in a family of 4 children, where I was exposed to numerous family health issues and navigating the health system. From the experiences of significant wait times to get into appointments and often having to travel for appointments,I developed a passion for rural health and any opportunity tohelp provide equal access to health care across rural Australia.

In 2021, I completed my surgical placement at the Whyalla hospital, and I was overwhelmed with the welcoming community and the sense of purpose and service, which I have never truly felt in the metropolitan hospitals. I deeply valued this sense of

community, which inspired me to further my rural medicine experience and seek the exciting opportunity of a whole year of placement at Port Augusta in 2022. I am so thankful for this opportunity to further develop my passion for rural health. Exposure to rural health disparities will motivate me to be the best doctor I can be to ensure I competently provide medical care as a rural practitioner when I complete my degree.

I would actively promote indigenous access to health care and do what I can to develop health literacy.

I have a great appreciation for how Rotary Clubs of rural towns facilitate a sense of community and opportunity for people within the community. I personally have often been involved in the Rotary Club in Victor Harbor by entering my own art works in the annual Rotary Art Show. I deeply value community and really enjoy any public speaking opportunities.

Upon completion of my degree, I hope to be an activist in recruitment for rural doctors and aid in the development of a strong and equal health care system in the rural setting in SA. I would be so grateful to be a recipient of the Australian Rotary Health Rural Scholarship to help me to achieve my dream to be a rural generalist doctor and help to promote equal access and break down barriers to health care access in the rural setting. Rotary's Official Position on Covid 19 and Vaccination

(Letter to the Club from DG Jeff Neale) Hi Keith,

The health and wellbeing of members and the public, should be front of mind for all Rotary clubs particularly in these challenging times associated with Covid-19.

Attached is a communication from Rotary International outlining its official position on Covid-19 and vaccination. In addition to the advice from RI the District Leadership Board would like to advise that all attendees at a District run event will be required to be double vaccinated.

Further, the District Leadership Board recommends the following:

- Clubs review all activities (i.e., club meetings, project work, fund raising, exposure to the public) taking into consideration the age demographic of their members, exposure to potential Covid-19 and the safety of the public.
- Clubs mandate members (and guests) be double vaccinated to attend club meetings, project work, fund raising and exposure to the public.
- For members that are not double vaccinated, clubs consider allocating these members duties that do not require contact with other members and the public.
- Further to recommending double vaccination, clubs should encourage members to obtain booster shots as recommended by the Health Authorities.
- Clubs comply with all Federal and State Government regulations, including but not limited to, the wearing of face masks, social distancing, venue density requirements. As an aside we have been advised by Rotary's insurers that reckless disregard for Federal and State Government regulations may result in insurance coverage being withdrawn.
- Clubs make available masks and sanitizer for all activities.

Recognising the foregoing, clubs may consider reverting to Zoom meetings until the current situation and restrictions become clearer.

As a District we believe that we should lead by example, so in the short term, the District Leadership Board and District Leadership Team will meet via Zoom.

As you are all aware, these are challenging times and as a volunteer organisation we have a responsibility to look after each other and the public.

Rotary International and The Rotary Foundation's position statement on COVID-19 vaccination

As the first organization to envision a polio-free world through mass immunization of children, Rotary believes the decision to vaccinate is a humanitarian imperative. The Rotary International Board of Directors and Rotary Foundation Trustees believe that:

- 1) Global vaccination is the path to ending the pandemic, and we strongly encourage vaccination for all individuals, including our members.
- 2) Misinformation hinders the fight against COVID-19, and we are committed to providing our members with science-based information.
- 3) Rotary is engaged in assuring equity in vaccine access to all people. Through joint efforts with Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance we are leveraging our frontline experience with polio to facilitate vaccine delivery.
- 4) Rotary salutes health care workers everywhere as they continue to provide lifesaving services. We encourage clubs to offer recognition and encouragement to these heroes.
- 5) Rotary and Rotaract clubs are encouraged to redouble their efforts to support COVID-19 prevention and vaccination efforts.
- 6) As one of the greatest advances of modern medicine, vaccines are safe, effective and save millions of lives each year. They have eliminated or controlled numerous diseases such as polio, smallpox, measles, and Ebola, and now, there is the opportunity to end the COVID-19 pandemic through vaccination.
- 7) The eradication of polio remains the goal of the highest order for Rotary. We can continue to apply the lessons we have learned in fighting polio to COVID-19 response efforts.
