- The Shed will trade with a customer limit of 25 at one time
- All workers and clients will be double vaxxed, wear masks and practise social distancing

- The Friday work and other processing of goods will continue
- Masks must be worn by workers and clients during pickups
- The new evaporative coolers will be used constantly during Shed work
- Two Covid Marshalls will be rostered each Saturday

Environmental initiative with NPSP Council

A very recent meeting with Council representatives came very close to finalising the outlines for two projects.

The first will involve school students on visits to the St Peters Billabong, which will probably involve tree planting, and the second to the Felixstow wetlands supported by a member of the Kaurna community. Jenah Bambrick, the youth officer will be developing the detailed arrangements for these visits. The intention (Covid willing) would be to complete these before June.

For the second project, we are developing a grant application form for schools, community groups etc. to apply for grants of up to \$1000 to support an environmental initiative. Applications will be invited through Council print and digital communications during the first half of 2022 with projects to start in the next Rotary year. At this stage we believe we could support 2-3 projects at the maximum amount.

International News

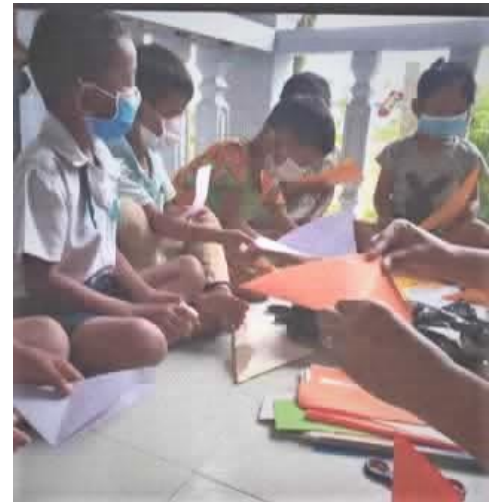
1. All Kids, Cambodia – RAWCS Prep Trabaek Early Learning Centre Project

The RAWCS Prep Trabaek Early Learning Centre Project is up & running with 50 students now attending. The older students have commenced computer classes with children as young as 5 joining the kindergarten classes. A local fisherman even brings his 3 children from a nearby island by boat. Many items have already been purchased for the new centre (desks, chairs, generator ect). To date donations of \$18,153 have been received from various Rotary Clubs & Rotarians for this project.



2. All Kids, Cambodia – Garden Party fundraiser

Three committee meetings have already been held for the AllKids Garden Party fundraiser which is to be held at St Peters Girls College on 27th March. The flyer advertising the event has been produced & promotion of the event will begin in February. Rotarian John George has already organised 4 tables of guests & expects those who attended the previous garden party will be keen to attend. The situation with the current Covid Omicron outbreak will be monitored. Club members are requested to set aside this date in their diaries.

- ☐ Sore throat lozenges
- ☐ A plan for who can look after your children, pets, or people in your care if you have to go to hospital
- ☐ Masks, hand sanitiser and gloves
- ☐ A plan for how you'll get food and essentials for two weeks. (know how to order online or have a family member/ friend who can drop off supplies)
