Guest Speaker- Kelly-Ann Tansley

The Zhara Foundation

Chairman John Gallehawk introduced Kelly-Ann Tansley, General Manager of the Zahra Foundation.

The Zahra Foundation was established in 2015 following the tragic murder of Zahra Abrahamzadeh, who was killed by her former husband in 2010 after enduring 20 years of domestic violence.

“The foundation aims to assist women who have been threatened and abused in the hands of their partners. And mothers that want to save their children from violent homes. The goal of the foundation is to empower these women to stand on their own feet. This foundation will also be a tribute to women who sadly lost their lives in search for hope of a better life for themselves and their children.”

“We are a South Australian based charity supporting women and children affected by domestic and family violence. We specifically address the financial abuse and disadvantage women experience as a result of domestic violence, providing specifically tailored programs and services that promote the economic empowerment of women.” *From the Website*

To 2021 1000 women have been supported through programs. For Example: “The Zahra Foundation provides a ‘Pathways to Empowerment’ program which is a 9 week course (1 day per week) for women or non-binary people who have been affected by domestic and family violence. The program aims to break social isolation, connect participants to information, resources and to assist in reconnecting with values, hopes and dreams.”

Domestic abuse does not discriminate.

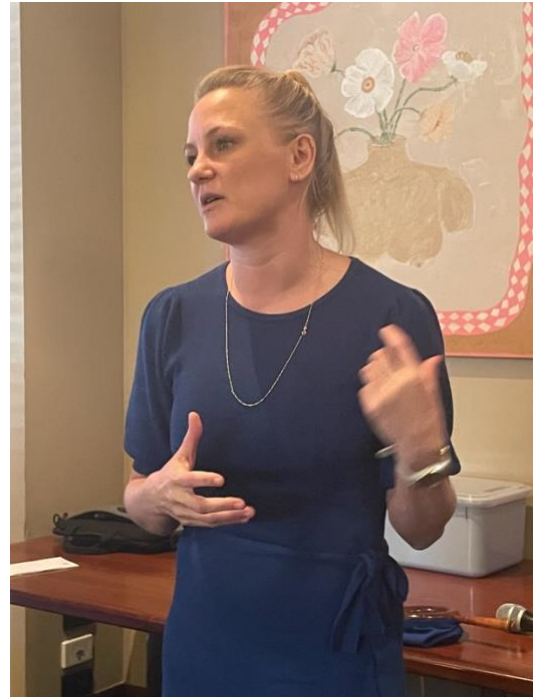
As members of the community we are urged to call out poor behaviour, sexism and derogatory comments.

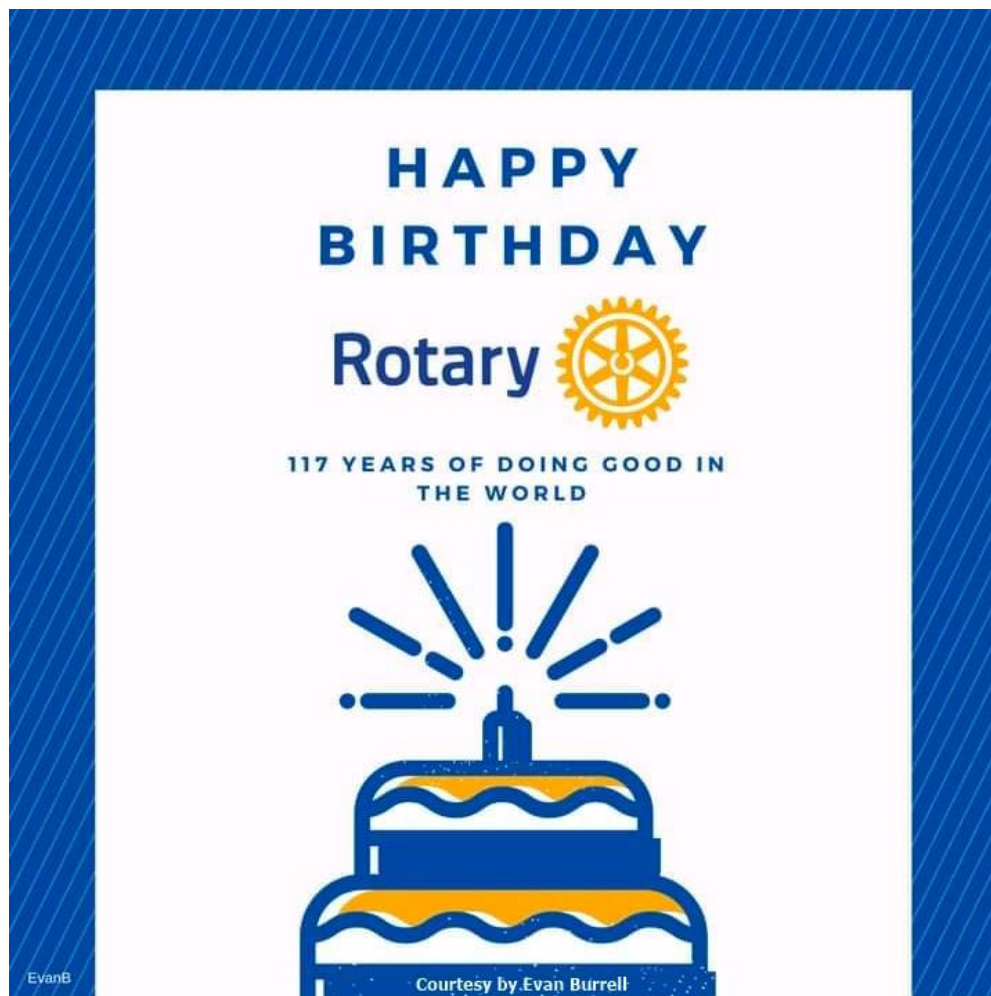
