Guest Speaker -



Chairman **John Gallehawk** introduced guest speaker **Graham Jaeschke**, General Manager of **The Smith Family**, South Australia and the Northern Territory. The Smith Family is a national, independent children's charity helping disadvantaged Australians to get the most out of their education, so they can create better futures for themselves.

Graham joined The Smith Family 13 years ago. Previously he was the State Director of the Liberal Party in New South Wales, South Australia and Queensland. He attended Flinders University and majored in politics and geography, receiving a BA (Honours) degree.



The Smith Family has been working to improve the lives of children living in disadvantage for 100 years. Today they're supporting students, helping to break the cycle of disadvantage through targeted, long-term support for their education and providing opportunities to help students transition from school, tertiary education or training into the workforce. The children they assist frequently come from single parents, Aboriginal families, unemployed people and people with disabilities.

Vocational/ Youth Service Director Romaine Dawson thanked Graham for his talk and presented him with a cheque for \$1,000 from the Rotary Club of St Peters. Individuals and businesses can support The Smith Family with tax deductible donations.

Jennifer Jones – Rotary International President 2022-22

Rotary Club of Windsor-Roseland, Ontario, Canada

Jennifer Jones is the founder and president of Media Street Productions, an award-winning 27-year-old media company in Windsor, Ontario. She is a member of the Rotary Club of Windsor-Roseland.

Jennifer's talents have strengthened Rotary's reach and impact as she has served in roles including vice president, director, Rotary Foundation trustee, and co-chair of the End Polio Now: Make History Today fundraising campaign.

Jennifer is a leader in cultivating experiential fundraising opportunities, such as a day of golfing with Rotary polio ambassador Jack Nicklaus in Jupiter, Florida, USA, that raised over \$5.25 million for polio eradication. She also led the innovative RotaryResponds virtual event in May 2020, which raised money for COVID-19 relief projects and showcased how Rotary members were responding to the pandemic around the world.



Working alongside political figures, celebrities, and global leaders, Jennifer has raised awareness and hundreds of millions of dollars to eradicate disease, support peace, and provide clean water and sanitation. An expert storyteller, she inspires hope and promise and motivates people to take action.

She has received the Service Above Self Award and The Rotary Foundation Citation for Meritorious Service. She holds a Doctor of Laws (LL.D.) and has been recognized with the YMCA Peace Medal and the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal, and she was the first Canadian to receive Wayne State University's Community Peacemaker Award.

Jennifer is married to Rotary member Nick Krayacich, a family physician. They share a love for travel, cycling, golf, and relaxing at their family cottage, in addition to adventures such as climbing to the summit of Kilimanjaro in Tanzania.

Jennifer and Nick support The Rotary Foundation as members of the Arch Klumph Society, Paul Harris Society, and Bequest Society.

Jennifer Jones began her term as Rotary International's 2022-23 president in the midst of her Imagine Rotary Canada Tour, traveling coast to coast to coast to draw attention to the positive and lasting impact that Rotary clubs have in their communities.

"The Canada tour was awesome because it brought together different demographics," she said. "Every stop was representative of all ages, all cultures. The Rotary family was so excited to be together, to be in person, and showcase what they were doing. There were incredible, incredible things that people planned."

"Engaging with First Nations and Indigenous people was an element of every one of the stops," Jones said, recalling an encounter with Bruce Starlight, a Tsuut'ina elder, in Calgary. "To be able to sit and learn from each other, to talk, to ask questions. That was a big part for me personally: the ability to learn how Rotary fits in and what clubs are doing to move forward with truth and reconciliation."
