Guest Speaker

Peter Nicholls was introduced by John Gallehawk, who said Peter's life could be summarised as 'Enjoy being You'. Some years ago, Peter changed his lifestyle to become a Life Enjoyment Mentor.

Peter introduced his talk by quoting Bill Gates. Bill was asked 'what's the difference between rich and poor' and his answer was 'it's got nothing to do with financial wealth'. There are plenty of people in the world who are not financially wealthy but have very rich lives. We all have the potential for the second half of our lives to be the richest.

The first half of life, up to about 40 to 50 is mostly set out - education, finding a job, marrying and raising a family. Then people wonder what the rest of life will be like for them. We're born alone, we die alone but in between we crave social connection.

Peter said 'understanding self' was important and whilst there is plenty of knowledge now available, what people need is insight. He said the second half of life could be described as the 'yummy years' when people can take control of their own life and run it as they want to.

Rotary and other service clubs can play an important part. People can join whilst they are working and then continue on when they retire.

DESIGN AND CREATIVIY AWARDS INFORMATION**

Romaine Dawson - Youth and Vocational Director

Origin -

Rotary has historically had an incentive / reward program called the 'Pride of Workmanship Award' which aimed to recognize effort / excellence in skilled tradespeople.

Many years ago in the St Peters club a decision was made to source candidates from secondary schools rather than industry. We sought to identify and recognize students who excelled in 'non-traditionally-academic' areas such as crafts / photography / woodworking / engineering / art / design etc.

The program was re-named Design and Creativity Awards.

How are Awardees Chosen

We liaise with a number of secondary schools asking them to nominate a student or two who have excelled in the conception / execution of a physical project. Typically these are year 11 students who have undertaken a major project for a SACE subject such as art / photography / technology and maybe produced a portfolio of art or photography or an object such as an item of furniture, an arcade game, a lighting device etc.

Public Face of 'Design and Creativity' Award

The culmination of the program is a Rotary meeting where secondary students together with their teacher and families attend with our members and partners and visitors. We have a meal together. The students are introduced by the relevant teacher and then give a short talk about the project / work for which they are to receive an award. They then receive a certificate and cheque. Their work is displayed and an opportunity exists for visitors to examine the displays and talk to the students.

Where is it Held

More recently, the night has been held at the San Giorgio Centre, where the facilities include a dining area, a bar, a display area for exhibits, and audio-visual facilities. The centre makes all this available as part of a catering package for the meal.
