Guest Speaker

Mary-Anne Hannay introduced PDG David Jones, a member of the Mitcham Club.

David is currently the Chair of the District 9510 Rotary Youth Exchange Committee.

He said the Rotary Youth Exchange program commenced in 1929 in Copenhagen but it has only been an official Rotary program since 1972. The benefits of the exchange have been somewhat diluted by current communications and the internet.

It is a program for students enrolled in secondary education in years 9, 10 or 11. They must be aged 15 and not have turned 18 at the time of departure.

Can you make it happen?

"My youth exchange year was one of incredible change and growth for me. In addition to seeing so much of the rest of the world and making such wonderful friends, I changed in ways I never knew was possible. Thankyou Rotary for the best year of my life."



The Rotary fee for an <u>outgoing student</u> will be approximately \$9,000 which is paid by the student's family. The club obligations during the exchange are –

- 1 Communicate on a regular basis with the outbound student whilst on exchange.
- 2 Provide an opportunity for the student to address the club upon their return.
- 3 Provide a level of assistance to and accompany the student to the debrief session.

<u>Inbound students</u> need a student 500 visa issued through the Australian Home Affairs Department. Club responsibilities are –

- 1 To appoint a Rotarian as counsellor for the duration of the exchange.
- 2 Arrange schooling at an appropriate secondary school free of charge to the student.
- 3 Arrange travel to and from school.
- 4 Arrange accommodation for the student with host families at no cost to the student.

Costs to the Club are -

- 1 A monthly allowance of at least A\$150.
- 2 The cost of hosting the student at meetings.
- 3 Basic schooling costs such as uniform, hire of school laptop, books and travel to and from school.

David said that some of the concerns Clubs have when they are asked to host an inbound student are alleviated by the fact that the host families do not have to be Rotarians.



Parents of outbound students are encouraged to host and families in the school community may be willing to host.

However, families outside the Rotary community must be vetted and approved by the host club and briefed on their role and responsibilities.

Mary-Anne Hannay is one of the inbound student Co-ordinators.
