Report of Meeting 3250 held on Tuesday 22nd November at the Kensington Hotel

Sergeant **John Bested** called on **Bill Winslow** to give the Invocation and Toasts.

President Pam Vaughton welcomed Rotarians and guests, PDG Dick Cuttle, wife Karina and Gordon Brice from the Rotary Club of Onkaparinga.

Wendy Gaborit was on Zoom.

Pam commented on the very successful Design and Creativity Awards and expressed thanks to all involved, especially Romaine and Chris Dawson and Helen Moyes.

The AGM will be held next week and nominations for positions for the 2023-24 Rotary year can be made to Secretary Wendy Gaborit.

A board meeting will be held tonight following the Club meeting and any interested member is invited to attend.

Guest Speaker

Chairman Bruce Ballantyne introduced guest speaker PDG Dick Cuttle.

Dick told those present about the work being undertaken to restore fencing damaged in the Sampson Flat and Cudlee Creek fires in January 2015 and December 2019. Onkaparinga Rotary in conjunction with BlazeAid have been working to replace fences. It has been a RAWCS (Rotary Australia World Community Service) project.

They first started the fencing project in 2009 after the Black Saturday fires in Victoria.

Dick said that people burned out by a fire never recover. Some people have been still waiting on their insurance cover and some have had no assistance at all.

A contractor clears the old fencing and knocks new posts into the ground and the volunteers then use a special trailer to unroll fencing wire. PDG Jeff Neale has organised suitable vehicles from Paradise Mazda. They initially concentrate on boundary fences.

Dick invited club members to visit the area to see first-hand the work being undertaken. They gratefully accept cash donations which are put towards tool replacements as these are not covered by other grants.

Phil Smith thanked Dick for his presentation.

For many years the Rotary Club of St Peters has been sponsoring a student at St Judes School in Tanzania.

Back in 2006, The School of St Jude held its first ever St Jude's Day, a day for thanksgiving, celebration and sharing.

The whole school, which numbered just 662 primary students and 114 staff at the time, gathered for a service, entertainment by students and a special meal.

Sixteen years later, and the general format for the day has remained the same, but almost everything else has changed! In 2022, the school numbers 1,800, with more than 300 staff.

Back in 2006, St Jude's catered to the first five years of primary school, but today St Jude's comprises three schools; one primary and two secondary.

Though St Jude's is a relatively young school, its traditions, like the annual St Jude's Day celebration, have a special role in the school community.

Graduates this year include those in the fields of health sciences, engineering, education, and business.

These graduates are the fourth cohort of St Jude's alumni to graduate from tertiary studies, bringing the total number to more than 350.

With degrees and diplomas, they are now ready to begin impactful careers, fighting poverty in Tanzania.

"To our generous supporters, we thank you for your incredible support towards our education.

You have taught us a very important lesson about giving back and for that we stand proud and walk tall knowing that you made a difference in our communities and now the onus is on us to pay this forward.
