Guest Speaker

Milton Jones introduced PDG Marie Dorrington OAM, a member of the Rotary Club of Prospect.

Marie has been a passionate educator all her adult life, teaching in a number of schools in Adelaide and Darwin before becoming Principal of St Mary's College Adelaide from 1986 to 2004.

Following this she was a Senior Education Advisor in Catholic Education SA from 2004 – 2006 and had her own business as a Leadership Consultant from 2006 - 2012. This included many highlights especially leading educational study groups to Europe, Guatemala, El Salvador, Rwanda and Kenya.

Marie joined Rotary in 1997, because of the involvement of St Mary's students in Rotary Youth programs. She subsequently, found herself involved at District level in a range of roles including District 9500 Governor in 2012-13.

Marie has been actively involved in Interplast Australia and New Zealand since 2013 and she was asked to join the Interplast Board in 2015, becoming Chair of the Interplast Rotarian committee at the same time.

Still a member of both, Marie relinquished the position of chair of the Rotarian committee in 2020 to become chair of the Interplast Design, Monitoring and Evaluation Committee.

She is a member of the board executive and company secretary. In addition, Marie is also a company member of Interplast Australia and NZ. She travelled with the Interplast surgical team to Tonga in 2012.



Interplast sends teams of volunteer plastic and reconstructive surgeons, anaesthetists, nurses and allied health professionals to provide life-changing surgery and medical training in 17 countries across the Asia Pacific region.

They do this in partnership with local organisations, including hospitals, universities and local NGOs. Their mission is to 'repair bodies and rebuild lives' and they do this through providing surgical services to those who could not otherwise afford or access these, and by building the capacity of local medical systems through training and mentoring programs.



Local doctors and nurses come to Australia to be trained so they can return to their own country and perform the life changing operations.

Integrally involved in the establishment of Interplast in 1983 with the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons, Interplast is supported by Rotarians in clubs and districts throughout Australia and New Zealand. There have been over 27,000 operations carried out by Interplast surgeons and their teams.



Over 85 Rotarians have accompanied teams as observers and have returned to act as ambassadors of Interplast by spreading our word, voicing their experiences.

Since 1983, Rotarians have raised significant funds to support Interplast in repairing bodies and rebuilding lives.

Marie thanked the members of the Rotary Club of St Peters for their donations over many years.

Wendy Gaborit thanked Marie for her presentation.

The weather was good and we travelled with District 9510 Rotarians and partners up the Port River to the end of the Outer Harbour breakwater where the boat turned around and set sail for the return journey.

Assisting the crew were two young people who had participated in a Rotary Youth Sailing Voyage.



We were served a meal and several brave people (not us) took up the challenge of climbing the ladders to assist the crew.



Rotarian David Binks of the Rotary Club of Glenelg, having spent a lifetime designing, building and sailing yachts has been instrumental in promoting the Rotary Youth Sailing Voyages.

David was on this voyage and told those on board about the program and handed out brochures which said -

“The One and All tall ship will be in Melbourne in May/June 2023 as part of the International Convention's activities.

She will be taking Conference delegates on short lunch and dinner cruises on the Yarra from Docklands.

This offers the opportunity for approx. 40 students aged 15-18 to help crew one of two special 7-day Sailing Challenge voyages from Adelaide to Melbourne and return.

A representation of both South Australian and Victorian students will partake on each voyage.”
