Paul was working in Cambodia and realised that many children we're not getting an education.








John showed a series of slides taken during the opening of the Prek Trabaek day care centre.

President Pam called on PDG Keith Shaw to give a brief outline of the origins of PHFs.


Keith said the first donation to the Rotary foundation was at the 1917 convention when a donation of \$26.50 was made.

#### Vocational/Youth Director Romaine Dawson - New Rotary Health St Peters Rotary Club Scholarship holder

The Youth Committee decided to again sponsor a one-year Rural Placement Medical Health scholarship for a student attending Adelaide University. The scholarship started on January 1 and concludes in December 2023.

We farewell Brigitte Treloar after her one year in Port Augusta and wish her all the very best in her sixth, final year of medical training.

Our new scholarship holder is Katherine Dumas. Katherine is a fifth year Adelaide Uni Medical student whose home is WA who has extensive experience in a vast number of rural and remote communities mentoring sporting activities across WA and now running the Yalata Indigenous kidney Health Festival and attending John Flynn in Kapunda.

Katherine will spend her 5th year in Whyalla and apart from her medical training, plans to integrate into the sporting community through local teams such as hockey, netball or footy. A very active person, Katherine has been completely financially independent and has managed to purchase a car, required for her 5th year by the rural clinical school.

She is the University Rural Health Alliance president (volunteer) which limits her ability to earn the high cost to join such teams as well as manage the high rental costs of living. The scholarship will enable this enterprising and highly Involved student to achieve her aims through less necessity to raise personal funds to achieve all her goals and challenges. These include running interactive health education activities and working with the dialysis bus.


