## Report of Meeting 3256 held on Tuesday 31st January at the Kensington Hotel

### Guest Speaker

**Rotarian John George** introduced Andrew Costello, better known as 'Cosi' of 'South Aussie with Cosi' fame.

Andrew started by noting that he was recently pictured on the front page of The Advertiser kissing a camel.

He grew up on a farm and has always been familiar with livestock, but he never envisaged that he would ever be setting up a charity such as Cows for Cambodia.

He said he had a good family life, attended Roseworthy College and worked as a pig vaccinator, sleeping rough and travelling from farm to farm. He now has a farm with sheep and cattle in the Adelaide hills.

During a visit to Cambodia he couldn't believe that people lived like they do, surviving with subsistence agriculture. He saw that having a cow in Cambodia is a means by which a family can have a better life.

However, the cost of a cow is well beyond the reach of most families, so Andrew set up a fundraising venture in Australia to provide money for the Cows for Cambodia project.

It has taken several years and a lot of experience to establish an efficient way to use those funds.

Basically, a family is loaned a pregnant cow which they care for and they are allowed to keep the calf and then return the cow so another family can benefit.

Andrew gave some amusing anecdotes, such as difficulties training the Cambodians in animal husbandry and describing the way cows are pregnancy tested.

The project has now reached the stage whereby the Cambodians can manage the project themselves.

Andrew said they are now expanding the program to Botswana where they have unique issues such as lions taking a liking to the cows.


