## Guest Speaker

Chairman **John Gallehawk** introduced guest speaker **Dr Anna Finizio**.

Anna commenced by saying she has had a difficult couple of years with disappointments with her personal life and her career aspirations. She spoke about her activities as a young Rotarian and as a member of the Liberal Party. She is most concerned about getting younger people, especially young women engaged in both Rotary and in positions of influence in the community.

She said 80% of adults now use social media on the internet, so we need to use all available social media channels to encourage those young people to participate in community activities. Also, young people are not interested in the traditional formalities of meetings, rather they just want to get things done.

Anna sees a need for the St Peters and Kent Town Clubs to work more closely together. She, personally, wants to immerse herself in helping other people.

The Men's Kitchen Association states that it is a program where older men can come along and develop a little cooking confidence thereby equipping them to be more self-sufficient at home and to foster the kind of friendly and supportive climate amongst all who attend. **Keith Payne** – Environmental grant to Ferox Australis for new signage at St Peters Billabong.

In 1990-91, RI President Paulo V.C. Costa made the environment one of his primary causes, creating the Preserve Planet Earth subcommittee, which looked at ways clubs and members could conduct environmental initiatives.

"We have finally caught up to Costa [his vision]," says Past RI President Ian H.S. Riseley, chair of the Environmental Issues task force, which championed the new area of focus. "As a lifelong environmentalist, I'm delighted that our great organization has recognized that the environment is a worthy and appropriate destination for our project activity," says Riseley. "This is an exciting moment in Rotary history."



Supporting the environment becomes Rotary's seventh area of focus, which are categories of service activities supported by global grants.

The Rotary Club of St Peters has taken up the challenge of including the environment in its projects. Our Club, through the Vocational/Youth committee, invited groups to apply for a grant and we received 5 applications – 3 from schools and one from the Community Garden and the fifth from the group Ferox Australis.

Ferox Australis, Latin for Wild of the South, is an Australian based not-for-profit incorporated organisation aimed at engaging citizens in science globally. The ethos of the organisation is to increase public environmental education through the use of citizen science-related tools and initiatives.

This organisation applied for a grant to install interpretive signage at the St Peters Billabong.

I met with Seamus Doherty the Co-Founder and Vice President of Ferox Australis to discuss their project. Seamus is currently undertaking his PhD in environmental research and is a biologist and citizen science leader.



**BIODIVERSITY IN THE BILLABONG**

**What is citizen science?**

Life in the billabong can be monitored in different ways, one of which is by the participation of people like you! Citizen science is the participation of community members in scientific research, contributing to scientific discoveries. Everybody can play a role in monitoring the billabong and helping protect our local biodiversity.

**How can I get involved?**

Scan the QR code and register a free account on the online citizen science platform, iNaturalist.

On the app, you can record observations of wildlife, connect with experts and other members of the community to help identify observations, learn more about nature, all whilst helping scientists to better understand more about the local biodiversity.

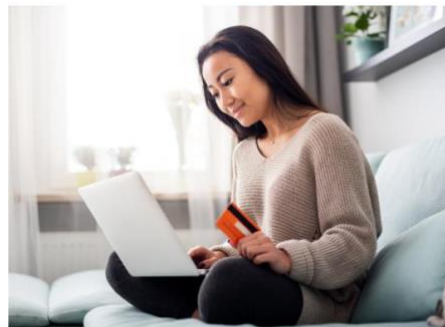
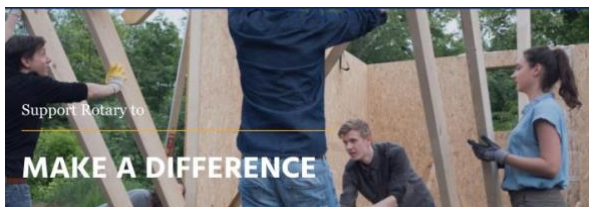
