David Wark has been the chairperson of Operation Flinders for the past 4 years.



The city office is at 12 Angus Ave, Edwardstown.

Operation Foundation works to transform the lives of young people from the age of 13 - 18. The 8-day program is held in the northern Flinders Ranges on Yankaninna Station where young people trek up to 100km, experience abseiling, Indigenous culture, bushcraft and build self-confidence through challenging themselves.

These young people come from all across South Australia and are typically referred to us as part of a team of 10 from one school or agency.

Once the young person completes the course the program lets children believe that we are all built equally but some choose to find the wrong path. The program allows for the students to make positive choices in their lives. Two Volunteers lead each group.

Many of the discussions are held in the evening around a campfire.

There is a follow up program 2 months after completion for all called WTF (What the Future).

The program teaches ambition and resilience.

David said he would like all Rotarians to **speak and listen** to what young children have to say. Be a role model and listen.



Romaine Dawson proposed a vote of thanks and presented David with a cheque from the Youth Community and Community Committees.
