Guest Speaker

Rebecca Quartermaine was introduced by Milton Jones.



Rebecca outlined the work being undertaken by the organisation Youth Opportunities.

In 1997, Peter Marshman founded this charity with the aim of developing the leadership skills of young people and by helping shape the future of young people experiencing disadvantage. Youth Opportunities has been delivering personal leadership programs for over 25 years, working with 16,000 people - positively impacting their schools, families and communities.

The Personal Leadership Program gives tomorrow's leaders the ability to make positive life choices, breaking the cycle of long-term unemployment and disadvantage by developing emotional intelligence and resilience in young people by giving them the tools they need to thrive in school, work and life.

Rebecca said that at the moment there 1.2 million Australian children and young people growing up in poverty. The barriers to achieving success are greater for students with social and financial disadvantage, making them at greater risk of being left behind due to fewer opportunities and resources.

They begin working with young people from about 15 years of age by giving them the motivation to attend school and be an active participant in their studies. They work in schools throughout South Australia facilitating parent and student workshops.





Rebecca introduced Sharni, a Youth Opportunities graduate who said that, following a family bereavement, the program gave her a positive outlook on life and better communication skills. She is now a staff member of Youth Opportunities.

In answer to questions, Rebecca said the organisation receives some Government support but relies on donations. They hold two major fundraisers, a Stars in the Garden event for major benefactors and an annual golf day.

Dennis Henschke thanked Rebecca for her presentation.





The first meeting of the provisional Club was held at the Avenues Hotel, St Peters on Tuesday 22nd March 1958. The Charter was granted on 29th April 1958 under the sponsorship of the Rotary Club of Adelaide. There were 23 Charter Members and Lionel Catt was elected President.

The first Jumble Sale was held in March 1961 and it raised £300.

In 1978, the Club built the Rotary Shed on Council land adjacent to Linde Reserve with Peter Slattery taking a leading role.

In 1981, the Club participated in its first FAIM trip with building work undertaken in PNG.






Members' Minutes
