The Women's Community Centre SA Inc. is a not-for-profit charitable community organisation that has provided services and programs for the women, children and youth of SA.

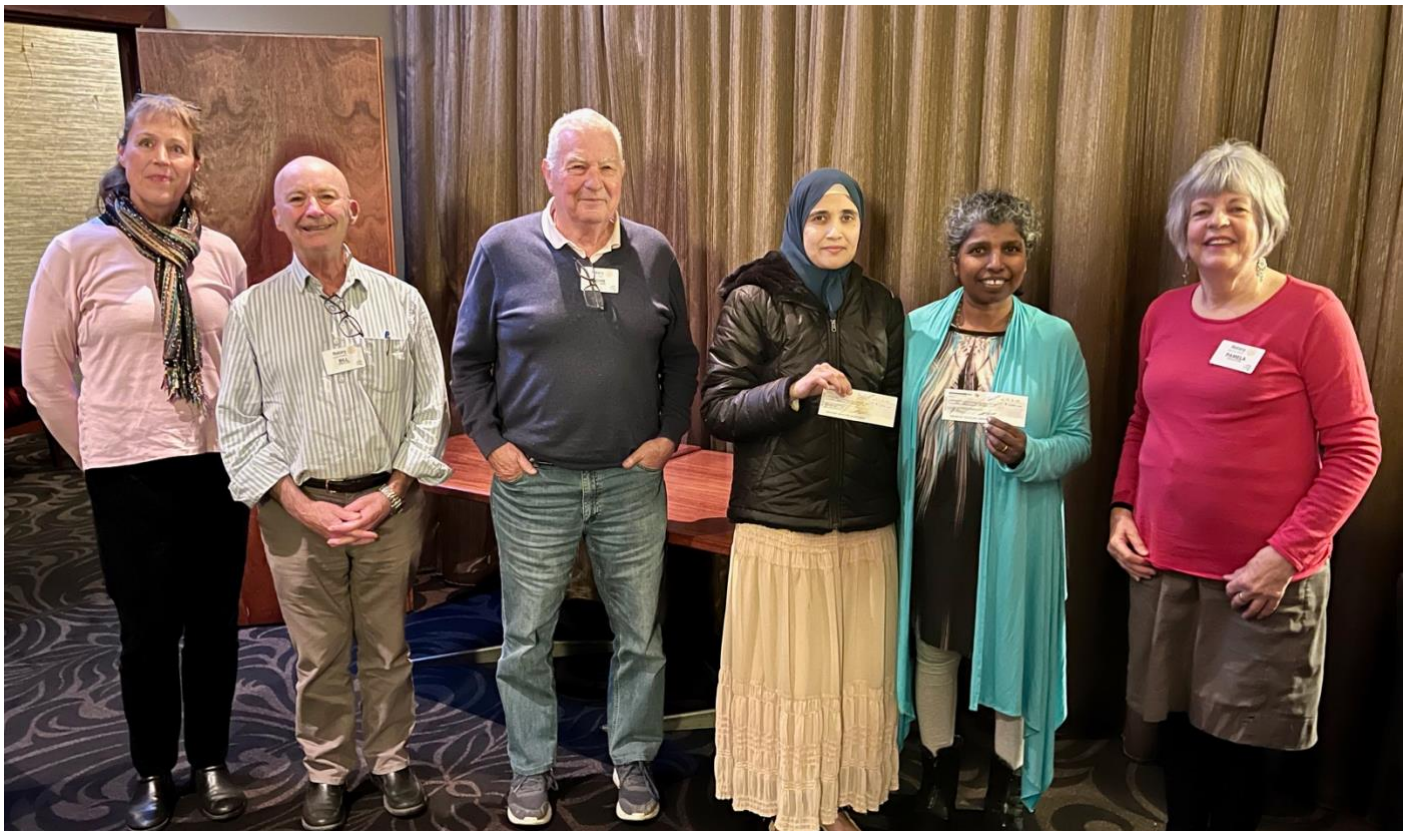

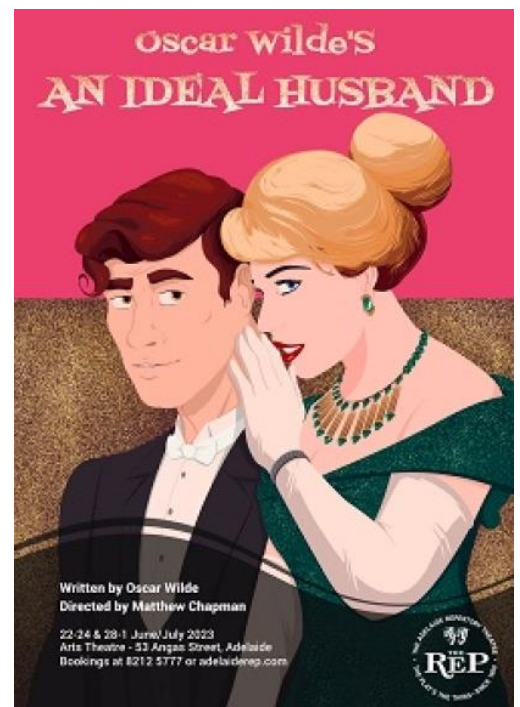
