The DECIDE study is looking for people with knee osteoarthritis who are considering keyhole surgery. The team will examine the value of two different information handouts for these people.

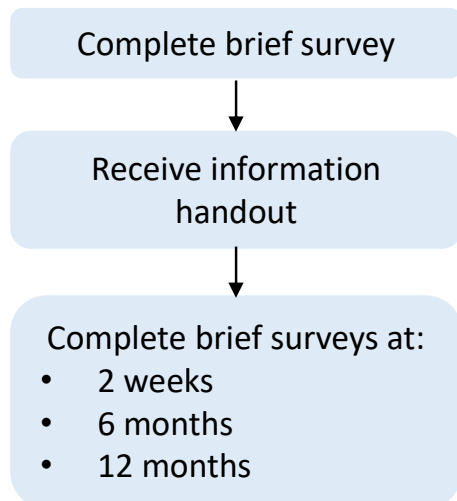
