Paul Otto, Coordinator from **Allkids Cambodia** was welcomed as the **Guest Speaker**.

President's Announcements

The Attendance List for Dave and Amy's farewell is being circulated.

The Shelter for the Shed has received final Council Approval and the kit has been ordered.

The NPSP Council has put the proposal of lighting up the Town Hall in End Polio Colours on a meeting agenda.



24 October is the date for highlighting the End Polio Campaign – One day – One Focus: Ending Polio.



Chairman John George introduced Paul Otto.

Paul has been working in Cambodia with **Allkids** for over ten years. The first project was the dental scheme supported by the RC of St Peters and MGA Insurance. Oral hygiene is critical to cognitive development.

Through the Kids to School project, AllKids provide students with all the materials which they need and the team work closely with local public schools to financially assist vulnerable families, allowing even the most underprivileged children access to education.

Since AllKids commenced operations in 2012, student enrolments in the 4 public schools which the team work with increased by 17%. <https://www.allkids.org.au/allkids-learning-centre/kids-to-school-2/>

This year another centre (newly built) was opened.

Prek Trabaek is located in the south eastern corner of Ream.

Just over 90 school aged children live in the area and the closest public school is 17.5 kilometres away.

Providing these kids with access to a variety of educational programs will complete AllKids mission to give all children in the Ream Commune access to education.

This new school was partly funded as a RAWCs Project through Jenny Neale, partner of PDG Jeff Neale and championed throughout the District 9510 by Wendy Gaborit, Secretary of the RC of St Peters.

Photos showed a modern school with sparkling facilities.

"Since the commencement of AllKids in 2012, it has always been our primary objective to ensure that all children in the Ream Commune of Cambodia, have access to education. Since then, AllKids have provided educational services to over 1500 children.

Prek Trabaek is located in the south eastern corner of Ream. Just over 90 school aged children live in the area and the closest public school is 17.5 kilometres away. Providing these kids with access to a variety of educational programs will complete AllKids mission to give all children in the Ream Commune access to education.

AllKids thanks Rotarians from District 9510 for kind donations towards the Prek Trabaek Project, supporting the development of a learning centre and day care program for vulnerable children who otherwise would receive no education at all." 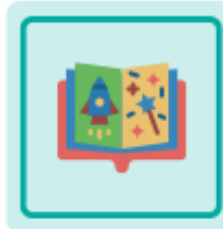

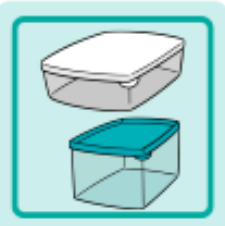
